Parents we are asking for your assistance with what has become a significant problem. Spring has sprung here at Reno High and we have seen a "blossoming" of inappropriate attire. We need your help in policing your student before they leave for school. So that there is no confusion, the following type of attire is completely unacceptable:

- Off the shoulder tops of any kind (this includes those with lingerie showing)

Students with inappropriate attire will be sent down to the office where they will be required to change into loaner clothes or clothes parents bring.

Our staff members have been dealing with an increase of vaping on campus. We have had students vaping at football games, dances, on campus, in bathrooms and actually in classrooms! We are asking for parent and student support on this issue as this year ends and next year begins. How do we deal with this issue? The language in our handbook includes vaping with smoking cigarettes (not within line of sight of the school), however there is no way for school officials to truly know what is actually being smoked and the technology is rapidly changing all the time. We will be increasing the severity of consequences for vaping on campus and during events next school year.
