Reminders/Important Notes:

- **GRAD NIGHT CELEBRATION at Santa Cruz Beach Boardwalk, June 8**th-**9**th: Registration/payment (\$200) was due by May 1st but there may still be room. Email rhsgradnight2019@gmail.com. Scholarships are available.
- SCHOLARSHIP CONVOCATION: May 22ND, 6:30pm, at the Peppermill Resort/Casino. If you turned in a Scholarship Notification form by 5/1 then we are expecting you. If you did not receive an invitation then you can pick one up in The CUBE.
 - Please update Mrs. Lerude in The CUBE **BY MAY 24**TH if you receive additional scholarships so she can include them in the graduation program.
- If you have *NOT* already turned in a SCHOLARSHIP NOTIFICATION form and *ARE* receiving merit-based aid to the college that you will be attending you still have time to be acknowledged as a scholarship recipient at graduation (and included in the program). Please fill out a Scholarship Notification form (available in The CUBE) and return it to Mrs. Lerude by May 24th.

Testing News/Resources:

- **AP EXAMS:** Keep your AP exam number so you can access your scores...you may need to send official score reports to your college.

What Should College Bound Seniors be Doing?

- **UNR BOUND?** Make sure and log into your **My Nevada** account. Under the Student Navigation box open your "To Do" list to confirm that you have taken care of details (like officially accepting admission).
 - Nevada Fit: Boot camp for Academic Success, August 17th -22nd. Some colleges require you attend and automatically enroll you. Space is limited for those that are not enrolled by their college. Apply online at https://www.unr.edu/nevadafit ...great program which correlates to a higher GPA in college and increased grad rates.
 - *Advanced Registration Deposit*: Allows you to register for classes. Check your **My Nevada** account and do this NOW if you have not already.
 - Living on campus? Now is the time to apply for housing and submit a deposit (\$325: \$200 of which is refundable if you notify them of intent NOT to live in the dorms by 6/15/19).

 - FIRST IN YOUR FAMILY TO GRADUATE WITH A 4-YR. DEGREE FROM COLLEGE? First in the Pack is designed to connect you to resources that increase your success. It is FREE and participation correlates to better grades and grad rates. Check it out/apply at <u>www.unr.edu/firstinthepack</u>

- **TMCC BOUND?** Make sure to check your student "To Do" list to confirm that you have completed all the steps to register for classes and to qualify for aid.
 - Nevada Promise Scholarship/Pell Grant recipients: It is critical that you check your TMCC student "To Do" list to confirm that there are no outstanding financial aid forms to complete. Most students that are eligible for Pell Grants are being required to fill out an additional verification form. Instructions are on your student "To Do" list if you have been selected for verification.
- HOW ARE YOU PAYING FOR COLLEGE?: Now is the time to tally the COST OF ATTENDANCE which includes tuition and fees, books, parking permit if you have a car, personal expenses, living expenses (including food). Then, subtract your grants, scholarships, aid and savings. Is there a gap? Develop a plan to fill it. Costs can be found on each college's website. See Mrs. Lerude in The CUBE if you have questions.
- **HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA TYPE:** Check with Mrs. McMullen (Registrar) to confirm that she has the correct diploma on file for you. Now is the time to make those changes.
- LET US KNOW WHERE YOU ARE GOING! Please let Mrs. Lerude or your counselor know where you are going to college or what your plans are after high school (if you don't fill out a scholarship notification form). We want to include you on the COLLEGE MAP in the hall.
- SUBMIT YOUR FAFSA! There is still time. Apply online at https://fafsa.ed.gov/
- Check your **STUDENT PORTAL** at the college that you will be attending. It is your job to make sure that the school that you will be attending has everything that they need to enroll you and disperse the aid that you qualify for.
- COLLECTING RHS GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS: If you received an RHS scholarship then you must provide proof of post-secondary enrollment to your college/university (student ID and full-time student status or schedule) to our bookkeeper, Ms. Herman, so she can disburse the funds to your college. She can be reached at 333-5050x3 or <u>bherman@washoeschools.net</u>. Scholarship funds will be deposited directly into your college/university student account. Any award money not claimed BY 2/1/2020 will be forfeited.
- **FINAL TRANSCRIPTS**: It is YOUR responsibility to order your final transcript and send it to your college, on <u>https://washoeschoolsnv.scriborder.com/</u>. This should be done in June.
- **MILLENIUM SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT?** You must accept the scholarship if you are attending a Nevada institution and want to use those funds. Your final transcript will be sent to the Treasurer's office by RHS. You will be notified by Nevada Treasurer's office by early August if you are a recipient. You must then accept the award for the funds to be dispersed.

Testing News/Resources:

- **NOW is the time for college bound JUNIORS to develop a standardized test strategy**! Should you take the SAT? Re-take the ACT? If so, when? There is no one answer for all students. Much depends upon your goals, reliance on financial aid to pay for college, etc. There used to be significant differences in the SAT and ACT. The revised SAT is now more similar to the ACT and aligned with the Common Core. So, you may not need to take both tests. The biggest mistake most seniors say that they made was not taking their standardized testing seriously as it impacts scholarship eligibility and college entrance (in some cases).
 - Subject Tests...do you need to take them? The vast majority of colleges no longer require subject tests. Many highly selective colleges do, particularly for Engineering or STEM majors. If you are considering applying to a highly selective school check their website to see if they prefer/require subject tests. Many students have more success taking a subject test after their corresponding AP subject test. Check the College Board website to see the list of subject tests and the dates that they are offered.
 - July ACT and August SAT tests filled up early last year: If you are planning to take either of these standardized test this summer then register early.

- ACT Resources: ACT has several prep options from free "Question of the Day" and strategy suggestions to their official ACT Prep Academy to tiered individualized (for-profit) options through a partnership with Kaplan. See <u>www.actstudent.org/testprep</u> for details.
- **SAT/Khan Academy Partnership**: College Board (designer of the SAT) has partnered with Khan Academy to offer **FREE** online prep for the SAT at <u>www.khanacademy.org/sat</u>.
- **For-profit testing companies**: There are plenty of options. Their effectiveness depends upon the student. Come see Mrs. Lerude in The Cube to discuss.
- **Colleges accept both the ACT and SAT**! It is a myth that colleges prefer one test over another. It may be unnecessary for you to take both. Come see Ms. Lerude if you are unsure.

- ACT Test Dates (<u>www.actstudent.org</u>): 6/8 (reg. by 5/3); 7/13 (reg. by 6/14... filled up early last year, act now); 9/14 (reg. by 8/16); 10/26 (reg. by 9/20); 12/14 (reg. by 11/8).

What Should College Bound Juniors be Doing?

- **Challenging Course Load Your Senior Year**: The more selective colleges look for students who continue to challenge themselves their senior year. It is up to you to find that balance between challenging yourself and not making yourself crazy!
- **Get Good Grades!** Grades matter for scholarships, college entrance and work readiness. If you are looking for merit aid to help pay for college then you should know that good grades=opportunity for merit aid=money to pay for college.
- **UNR Nevada Bound Tour**: These tours give students and their families an opportunity to learn about academic opportunities at UNR, tour a residence hall, and learn about admissions, financial aid and more. Register online at www.unr.edu/about/visit-campus.
- If traveling this summer, visit some college campuses...even if they are not on your list.
- If You Are Considering Out-of-State Colleges Begin to Compile Your College List. Use sites like College Greenlight or Big Future to research schools and find those that are a fit.
 - The goal is to have options your senior year (acceptance and ability to pay). Options are created by applying to a realistic/balanced list of schools, generally about 6-10 colleges. Mrs. Lerude can help you create a balanced list.
 - Early deadlines: application deadlines have become increasingly early, some mid-October of your senior year.
- **How Do You Spend Your Time Outside of Class**? Volunteer work? Internships? Paid employment? Involvement in your church? Sports? Clubs? Challenge yourself to try something new or to continue to pursue something that you are interested in. Be thoughtful in your choices. What matters is that you are getting involved and learning in the process.

- Playing a sport in college? The timeline for student-athletes is often accelerated. Make an appointment to meet with
