

- **Free online resources**: SAT (<u>www.sat.collegeboard.org/practice/</u>) check out the Khan Academy partnership on the College Board website which allows you to pull your PSAT/SAT test and customize a study plan for FREE; ACT (<u>www.actstudent.org/testprep/</u>)
- College and Career Center/RHS Library: Study guides are available in The CUBE and library.
- ZAPS at RHS: PSAT/SAT, Sat. 9/30, 9am-3pm; ACT, Sat. 9/23, 9am-3pm; www.register.doorwaytocollege.com, \$89.99
- For-profit testing companies: There are plenty of options. Their effectiveness depends upon the student. Come see Mrs. Lerude in The CUBE to discuss.

## What Should College Bound Seniors be Doing?

- Letters of recommendation requests: Many colleges require a recommendation letter from your counselor and 1-2 teachers. Identify which teacher/teachers (ideally from your junior or senior year) know you the best and can speak to how you show up in the classroom. Give them information to write an effective letter: updated resume (from Junior Interview?), copy of your college essay, etc. And, GIVE THEM A MINIMUM OF 2-3 WEEKS! Respect their time.
- *Finalizing your college list:* The goal is to have options. Options are created by a well- balanced list of schools. If you have your heart set on a highly selective school then put it on your list. Offset that by schools that you are fairly certain you will be accepted to. Schedule an appointment with Mrs. Lerude in The CUBE to review your list. There are hundreds of choices.
- **Spreadsheet with deadlines**: Meeting deadlines is key for maximizing financial aid options. Create a spreadsheet which lists the colleges that you are applying to and relevant deadlines: FAFSA, CSS Profile, application deadlines (sometimes accelerated to maximize aid), Early Action/Early Decision...
- BYU online classes: Make sure that your counselor knows which class/classes you are taking.
- *Get good grades!* Now is not the time to slack. Your grades matter for scholarships, college entrance and work readiness. Good grades=merit aid=options!

# Scholarships/Financial Aid

- Financial aid and scholarship search companies are big business: a multi-million dollar business! Finaid.org does a good job outlining what to be aware of, how to spot scams: <a href="www.finaid.org/scholarships/scams.phtml">www.finaid.org/scholarships/scams.phtml</a>
- **Scholarship matching sheet** is available in The CUBE. Come in and sign up. We will attempt to match you with scholarships that are a good fit with your background and interests.
- Check out the "Scholarship and Financial Aid" page at <a href="www.washoeschools.net/renohscc">www.washoeschools.net/renohscc</a> for an overview of the process and a place to begin. We will be updating this with specific scholarships beginning in September.
- *FAFSA*: Becomes available for the Class of 2018 on October 1<sup>st</sup>! It uses your 2016 tax information. For more information go to <a href="https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/">https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/</a>
- *FAFSA workshops at RHS:* Join us in The Cube on October 19th, 6pm, for an overview of the FAFSA. We will then split into two groups: one will head to the computer lab to begin filling out your FAFSA and the second group will discuss maximizing merit aid and scholarships. Bilingual support will be offered.
