Attendance Guidelines for Families

If the student must miss class for any reason, it is the parent/guardian's responsibility to see that a written/verbal excuse, explaining the cause of the absence, is provided by the parent to the school prior to, during, or within three days after an absence. If the parent/guardian does not notify the school of the reason for the absence within three days after the student returns to school, the absence will remain as Unverified (AUK) and will count against the 90% attendance requirement. If legitimate reasons, as determined by the Principal or his/her designee, caused the delay in notification, the absence may be changed from AUK to the appropriate code. NCU code is used after the 3-day period when an excuse is presented. Please note that just because a parent provides a verbal or written excuse, the absence is not necessarily approved


STUDENT LEADERSHIP NEWS


