# ALGEBRA 2 HONORS COURSE SYLLABUS FALL 2017/ SPRING 2018

This class will focus on the development of essential concepts necessary to progress in the mathematical sequence of courses. Algebra 2/Algebra 2 HONORS is a prerequisite for Trigonometry, and Calculus. Emphasis will be placed on problem-solving, real world applications and the use of graphing and scientific calculators. <u>If possible</u>, each student should have a graphing calculator. Topics will include the following:

- Relations and Functions
- Systems of Equations and Inequalities
- Polynomials and Polynomial Functions
- Irrational and Complex Numbers
- Quadratic Equations, Relations, and Functions
- Rational Polynomial Expressions
- Exponential and Logarithmic Functions
- Statistics

<u>Sequence:</u> We will follow the sequence as presented in the Curriculum Map for this course available on the Galena High School website.

Goals: Students in Algebra 2 HONORS are to:

- Value mathematics
- Exhibit confidence in their ability to solve mathematical problems
- Reason mathematically
- Communicate mathematically
- Apply learned concepts to new situations

**Special note:** Second year Algebra is a difficult course and relies heavily on knowledge of material from the first year of Algebra. If your student did not do well in Algebra 1 (C or below), he or she is likely to struggle in Algebra 2 HONORS, needing extra help or a tutor.

**<u>Grading Policy:</u>** This class will be using the following grading scale:

- A 90-100
- B 80 89
- C 70 79
- D 60 69
- F 0-59

Tests 60%, Homework 10%, Quizzes 15%, Final 15% Homework will either be collected or checked daily. Quizzes will generally be given daily.

## HOMEWORK POLICY

Homework assignments are very important in regards to your grade in this class. I will number my assignments and post them online and on a bulletin board in my classroom in a timely manner. Points are awarded on a **genuine effort** to work out every problem. **Work must be shown** to my satisfaction. <u>A simple list of answers</u> will result in zero.

Each homework assignment is worth:

- 5 points if on time and true effort shown
- 4 points if on time with most work shown
- 3 points if late and true effort shown
- 2 points if late with most work shown

Your homework <u>must</u> be on notebook paper, <u>in pencil</u>, neat and have your name and **assignment number** and date on the top.

**<u>NOTE</u>**: If you are absent you are responsible for turning in your homework when you return. If you missed one class you have one class grace, if you missed two classes you have two classes grace, etc. before the assignment is considered late.

## TEST MAKE UP AND RETAKE POLICY

You **<u>must</u>** finish a test during the class period that it is administered. You cannot expect me to allow you to go home and continue a test that you have already seen the next day.

If you are absent for a test **you will be expected to take the test as soon as you return**. If you missed one class you have one class grace, if you missed two classes you have two classes grace, etc.

You may retake all the tests in this class. To be eligible to retake a test you must complete a different practice test <u>AND</u> show me the completed practice and your notes from this section. At this time I will answer any questions you have. If you do not take good notes and keep them organized you will not be allowed to retake the test.

ALL RETAKES MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE THE NEXT TEST. I WILL POST A DATE THAT IS THE LAST DAY I WILL ACCEPT A RETAKE.

#### CLASSROOM PROCEDURES:

- 1. You are expected to come to class on time. If you are tardy, you must report to the office for your admit to class slip.
- 2. You are expected to come to class prepared. This means that you bring your notebook and writing utensil to class everyday.
