



Q1. How familiar are you with the District's current funding challenges?


Q2. How familiar are you with the District's cost-cutting efforts?


Q3. a. Were you familiar with the fact that school districts' funding is set for the year?


Q3. b. Please indicate how you feel about the current state system to fund school districts


Q3. c. Please indicate how you feel about the overall level of funding provided to K-12 education by the State.


Q4. How familiar are you with the District's new approach to reduce programs that are lower priority and maintain or increase funding of higher priority programs?




Q7. Do you support increasing resources to lower-rated schools to increase their performance, if this meant reducing resources at higher-rated schools?








Q11. Did you attend any of last year's community forums?




Q12. Did you complete last year's online survey?


