Course Overview:

Students will study people, places and environments from a historical and cultural perspective. Students will gain an understanding of the history of the world and why the social, political, and cultural systems have taken the paths that they have. They analyze and evaluate the connections between the history of the world and where the world stands today. At this level, there is an emphasis on the practical and responsible application of the world's history to real life situations. Below is the course sequence listed by unit:

• You will have a variety of assessments throughout the course including exams, individual projects, group projects, essays, presentations, and quizzes. This gives me a better understanding of the breadth of knowledge you have gained with a variety of different ways to show it.

★ Word Wall

• A major part of this course will be our word wall. This wall will consist of key vocabulary from our units and will be used on a daily basis. You are responsible for knowing these words as you will see them in assignments and on exams/assessments.

★ Absent Work

• If you are absent you are in charge of making sure you get the necessary assignments upon your return. You can check Google classroom for any digital notes, the notebook list in class, the absent work copy bin, and your partner. You have the amount of days you were absent plus 1 to turn in the assignment.

★ Google Classroom

• There will be an online component to this course through Google Classroom. Many notes, assignments, rubrics, and homework will be posted and sometimes turned in using Google classroom. This will be a great resource for you if you are absent or if you'd like to review course material before assessments. You will receive a course code within the first few weeks of school to have access to our classroom. Class codes:



\star Remind

★ Late Work/Make-Up Work

• I do not accept late work. It is your responsibility to make sure your work is turned in on time. However, I know we are all human so you will receive 2 late passes per semester. ★ Choice Cards

You can earn a Choice Card for participating in our classroom in a positive way. Some of the ways you can earn a choice card are: helping a classmate, cleaning up the classroom after class, passing back graded work, being engaged in a group discussion, going above and beyond for an assignment, volunteering, giving an insightful answer or question in discussion, etc. Choice Cards can be saved up and used in a variety of ways using the Choice Card Menu. You can use and spend these Choice Cards how you see fit for you.

★ Roberts Roulette Wheel

• At the end of each unit we will spin the Roberts Roulette wheel by period to determine what will be graded from the unit notebook. Immediately following the results of the spin, you will turn in the selected assignment(s). If you do all of your notebook assignments, the odds will ALWAYS be in your favor.

★ Bathroom/Hall Passes

• You will receive 3 bathroom/hall passes per semester. Unused passes are worth 10pts extra credit each at the end of the semester.

★ Cell Phones/Electronics

- Cell phones and other electronics should be out of sight unless otherwise instructed by me. We will use cell phones for some assignments and when doing independent work.
- **Charging Station** Our class will have a voluntary charging station where you will have the ability to charge your phone during class. We all know how distracted we can be with our devices (myself included!) and this is a way to *"charge your device and charge yourself"* by taking an active role in your learning by engaging in what we are doing. You can earn Choice Cards for consistently placing your phone in the charging station. If I notice that you are being distracted by your device, I will ask you to place it in the charging station for the remainder of the period.
- Mrs. Roberts Cell Phone Policy:

Beginning of class	Cell phones (and headphones) should be on silent and out of sight, preferably in charging station.
During Instruction	Cell phones (and headphones) should be on silent and out of sight (hopefully in charging station) unless otherwise instructed.
Independent work	You may listen to MUSIC ONLY with headphones while you work as long as it isn't a distraction to you.
End of class	Cell phones should be on silent and out of sight until all work and/or exit tickets are complete, then may be used for personal use.

1st offense: Verbal Warning., **2nd offense**: Cell phone sent to charging station voluntarily., **3rd offense**: Confiscated for class period by Mrs. Roberts., **4th offense**: Technology violation referral and cell phone sent to office..
