- Appointments will be 30 min sessions



FSA ID

- Both students and parents will each need their own FSA ID to sign the FAFSA
- https://fsaid.ed.gov/npas/index.htm
- Tax documents needed
 - 2019 tax returns and W'2's for parents and students
 - If student did not work or file taxes they do not need anything other than their FSA ID
- October 1st
 - The earliest you can fill out the FAFSA application for the upcoming academic year

Federal Aid

- Pell Grant
 - Free money that does not need to be repaid back
- Work Study
 - Part-time employment for students with financial need
 - Earn money and help pay educational expenses
- Student Loans
 - Money that you borrow to pay for your education that must be paid back with interest
 - Private loans
