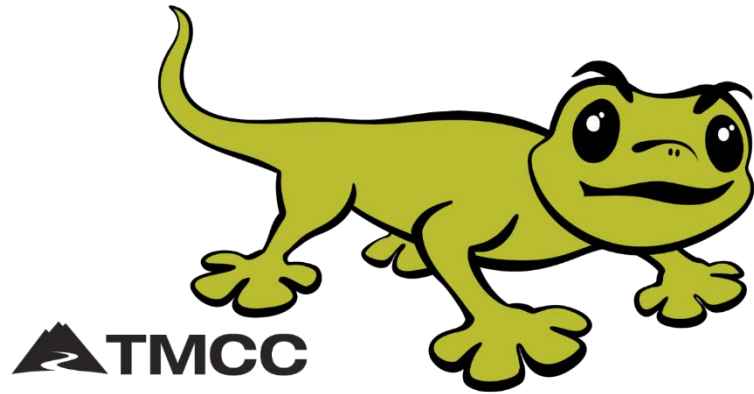

Dual Credit

- The opportunity for high school students to take college credit-bearing courses taught by college professors or college-approved teachers.
- In dual-credit programs, students earn credit that goes toward high school requirements; and at the same time, you also earn college credit.

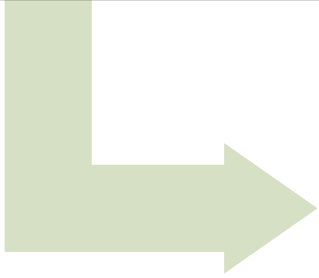
Credit Transferability

- Each school district, or in some cases each high school, determines what type and how much credit students receive for each college class.
- WCSD has a comprehensive list of how credits are accepted.

Jump Start Cohort Classes

- Classes offered onsite at the high schools
- Taught by TMCC faculty or qualified district teachers
- Students taking courses with fellow high school peers for Dual Credit
- Various discounts available
 - TMCC Instructor: 25% Discount
 - WCCSD Teacher at TMCC Campus: 33% Discount
 - WCCSD Teacher at WCCSD Campus: 66% Discount

J2TMCC – Jump Start to TMCC

- Classes offered at a TMCC campus (including online)
- Students taking college courses for either dual credit, personal interest, or advancement
- Discounts available
 - Online classes: \$50 plus fees
 - In-person classes 25% per credit discount plus fees

Benefits to Jump Start

- Opportunity to earn college and high school credit at the same time.
- College classes offered in various formats, such as online or in person.
- Access to TMCC student support services, such as tutoring, while taking courses at TMCC.

Student Responsibilities

- Students are responsible for all registration fees and other mandatory fees.
- Understand how TMCC classes are used to complete high school requirements.
- Work closely with your high school counselor or homeschool administrator
- College classes require more work and greater level of independence compared to high school classes
- Failing classes will have future consequences to GPA, Financial Aid, etc.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act

FERPA

- *Truckee Meadows Community College is required by federal law, regardless of age, to keep student records confidential.*
- *Without the student's express permission, TMCC cannot share student records with anyone but the student (or appropriate College employees, high school employees, or Dual Credit instructors).*
- *Parents or guardians must be authorized to view student records.*
