

<u>Nevada Promise Scholarship</u>

Steps to Earn TMCC's Nevada Promise Scholarship

Each step listed below is mandatory. It cannot be emphasized enough that failure to complete all requirements prior to each deadline will result in loss of scholarship eligibility.



Complete the Nevada Promise Scholarship Application

Class of 2025, fill out the online <u>Nevada Promise Scholarship Application</u> and submit it before midnight on October 31. Please see these <u>other</u> <u>scholarship opportunities</u> as well.

Apply for Admission

Complete the TMCC Application for Admission and view important dates and deadlines. If you have questions, contact Admissions and Records.

- Select the upcoming Fall Application for Admission
- Must be degree-seeking to qualify for financial assistance



Complete a Nevada Promise Program Training

You must complete this <u>training</u> no later than March 1.

Complete a FAFSA

All Nevada Promise Scholarship applicants must file a 2025–26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) no later than April 1.

- DACA students are required to complete the 2025-26 FAFSA
- Students not eligible to complete a FAFSA must complete and submit the <u>Non-FAFSA Filer Declaration</u> And Iter than April 1, and should <u>apply for</u> <u>additional aid as a FAFSA Non-Filer</u>.



Learn About Your Placement Options

New students have many options for <u>placement testing</u>: ACT or SAT scores, a qualifying high school GPA and AP scores. Scores must be less than two years old. You can submit official copies of your ACT and/or SAT scores to the Admissions and Records Office. Recent high school graduates may place using <u>alternate pathways</u>, using their high school coursework to qualify.

Complete New Student Orientation

Using your TMCC username and password, log in to your WebCollege <u>Canvas</u> account to access New Student Orientation. New Student Orientation is designed around you, helping to uncover answers to the questions you have and introducing you to resources, programs and services.

Complete and Report Community Service Hours

All students must complete and report 8 hours of community service no later than May 1. Visit our community service section for more information.



Meet with Your Assigned Mentor

You are required to meet with an assigned mentor at least one time no later than July 1. TMCC's Nevada Promise Office will match you to a mentor and notify you via email after completion and verification of your community service hours.

Complete Your Financial Aid File (To-Do List)

Check your Financial Aid To-Do list in your MyTMCC account and submit all required documentation to TMCC's Financial Aid Office no later than July 1. Contact the <u>Financial Aid Office</u> for assistance.

Register for Classes


You must register for at least **12 credits** that are required for your certificate or degree program at TMCC for Fall no later than July 1. Class registration is completed through <u>MyTMCC</u> using your TMCC username and password. Lastly, go to college! At the end of the year all your hard work will pay off and you'll attend college debt-free!

HOW DO I BECOME A

MILLENNIUM SCHOLAR?

Students will be eligible when **all** the following conditions are met: Graduate with a Nevada high school diploma^{**}

- Earn at least a 3.25 GPA (weighted or unweighted) or a qualifying test score of 1070 on the SAT or 21 on the ACT. ACT superscores are not accepted. Only composite scores from a single test date will be considered.
- Single test date will be considered.
 Complete the following core curriculum: 4 units in English, 4 units in Math (including Algebra II or higher), 3 units in Science, 3 units in Social Science or History.

• Be a Nevada resident for at least two years of their high school career All requirements must be met by the date of high school graduation.

MATRICULATION PROCESS

There is no application process for traditional students that graduate from a Nevada public, private or charter high school. Students qualify by meeting the eligibility requirements listed above. High schools and school districts submit student information for those who have qualified upon high school graduation.

SCHOLARSHIP DISBURSEMENTS

To receive the benefits of the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship (GGMS), students must enroll in an eligible institution of higher education in Nevada. Please note, receiving the Millennium Scholarship does not guarantee admission to any of Nevada's eligible in-state institutions.

To receive scholarship disbursements as a Millennium Scholar:

Students must be enrolled in a program of study leading to a recognized associate degree, baccalaureate degree, or pre-baccalaureate certificate.
Students must be enrolled in at least 9 semester credits at an eligible community college or 12 semester credits at another eligible institution.

MAINTAINING ELIGIBILITY

To maintain eligibility for the GGMS, students must meet three requirements at the end of each semester for which they receive funding.

To maintain eligibility as a Millennium scholar:

- Students must make satisfactory academic progress in their program of study.
- Students must earn at least a 2.75 semester GPA.
- Students must complete at least 9 semester credits at an eligible community college or 12 semester credits at another eligible institution.

If a student fails to meet the minimum requirements in any semester for which they received funding, the student will receive a strike, and the scholarship will be suspended. Eligibility for the Millennium Scholarship can be regained by meeting all the requirements listed above in a subsequent semester. If loss of eligibility is incurred a second time, the student will be permanently removed from the program.

All requirements for the scholarship are outlined in Nevada Revised Statutes Chapter 396, Board of Regents Handbook Title 4 Chapter 18, and NSHE Procedures and Guidelines Chapter 12. *This information is subject to any changes in State law, policies adopted by the NSHE Board of Regents availability of funding, and any related matters thereto.

** Applications for students who did not graduate from a Nevada public, private or charter high school can be found on the GGMS website www.nvggms.gov. *** A qualified SAT/ACT score only replaces a GPA below 3.25. Students are still required to meet the other requirements.
