Independent Reading/AR Student Contract

- I will review my point goal in Accelerated Reader and check my progress.
- I will read at LEAST 20 minutes per night.
- I will only test on books I have read <u>entirely</u>.
- I understand that the novel we read as a class will NOT count towards my AR points.
- I will not attempt to test on books I read in previous years (these are in the AR system).
- If I read a book that has been made into a movie or TV show, I will take notes (at least ten), or I will NOT be allowed to take the quiz (you can use these notes on the AR quiz).
- I understand I am not allowed to use digital books during my AR test.
- I will demonstrate my analysis of and interaction with my book by completing Reader's Journal assignments, which will be counted as a quiz grade in the gradebook.
- To take an AR quiz, I will ask my teacher. I will take the test at lunch in my teacher's classroom OR during class at appropriate times (determined by the teacher).
- I will not copy answers, tell someone the answers to a test, or try to get answers from someone else.
 I will not have anyone help me take a test, except my English teacher, if appropriate.
- I understand that any form of cheating (including using cellphones while testing) is inappropriate. (Any student found cheating will recieve no credit for Independent Reading/Accelerated Reader for the quarter).
- I will bring my AR book to every class every day.
- I will bring my AR book to my Enrichment class and read 100% of the time alloted for reading.
- I understand how I am graded. 1/3 of my grade comes from the average test score and 2/3 of my grade comes from my progress towards my point goal.
- I will meet my goal on or before the deadline for the quarter.

Music Exploration

Middle School Exploring Music is a course that is suitable for students with or without previous music experience. Although no prior knowledge is required, those who do have a background in music will find plenty to challenge and interest them.
