Each course is worth 0.5 credits per semester

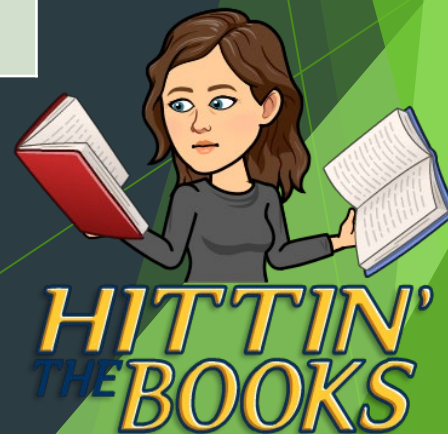

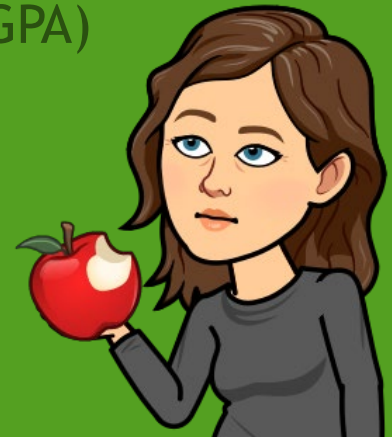


Grade Point Average (GPA)



Why is GPA Important?

- Determines your Diploma
- College Acceptance.
- Scholarship opportunities
FREE MONEY!
- Sports (2.0 GPA Eligibility)
- Dual Credit Options
- Apprenticeship opportunities.
- Off Campus as a Senior (3.0 GPA)



Dual Credit

- High school and college credit
- 3.0 GPA Requirement
- GPA Boost
- Grants available to help cover cost





Scholarship Updates

- 3.2 Unweighted GPA recommended to be competitive
- 3.5 unweighted for Presidential Scholarship
- Recommended Factors:
 - Participation in Leadership Activities
 - Community Service
 - Family & Work Obligations
 - Special Talents
 - Completion of Writing Sample (required for Presidential scholarship)
 - Academic Performance (Class Rank, AP, Honors, IB, Foreign Language, Weighted GPA, # of Core Classes)

HOW DO I BECOME A MILLENNIUM SCHOLAR?

Students in the Graduating Classes of 2017* and later will be eligible when all the following conditions have been met:

- Graduate with a Nevada high school diploma**
- Earn at least a 3.25 GPA (weighted or unweighted) or a qualifying test score*** (1070 on the SAT or 21 on the ACT)
- Complete the following core curriculum: 4 units in English, 4 units in Math (including Algebra II or higher), 3 units in Science, 3 units in Social Science or History
- Be a Nevada resident for at least two years of their high school career

All requirements must be met by the date of high school graduation.

- Available for ALL Nevada students!!
- Scholarship only for Nevada Colleges or Universities
- \$10,000 within 6 years
