### Community

Washoe County School District is the second largest school district in Nevada and serves over 64,443 students in the northwest corner of Nevada. Currently, the district consists of 14 high schools, 17 middle schools and 68 elementary schools plus a special education school, utilizing primarily a K–5, 6–8, 9–2 grade-level configuration. The student body is culturally diverse with a population that is 42% Hispanic, 3% African American, 42% Caucasian, 4% Asian, 1% Pacific Islander, 1% American Indian/Alaska Native, and 6% of students identifying as multiracial. 16% of students in the district qualify for an Individualized Education Plan (IEP), 14% of the students are considered English Language Learners, and 54% of the students qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch services. As a district the number of Children in Transition (CIT) students is 1% and Gifted and Talented (GT) are 4%.

### School

Hug High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 2,071 students in grades 9–12. The school opened in the fall of 1968 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 1970. Hug High School is a Title I school as recognized by the federal government, and 100% of the students and families at the school receive Free and Reduced Lunch services. The school's demographics have not fluctuated much in recent history; the majority of student being Hispanic (74%), 13% Caucasian, 3% African American, and 3% Asian, 2% Pacific Islander, 1% American Indian/Alaska Native, and 4% identifying as multiracial.

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## School Programs

The **academic program** is organized on a 4x4 block schedule. Students go to 4 classes each day and rotate between "A" days and "B" days. Eight 91-minute classes per semester is the minimum course load on our campus.

Students must complete an application to be a part of the Signature Academy and/or Career & Technical Education pathway.

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## Rank

A student's rank is based on their grade point average (weighted GPA).

## Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A minimum of 23 credits is **required for graduation**. **AP classes are weighted by a .05 bonus and Honors classes are weighted by a .025-point bonus**. Grades are recorded on the transcript and GPA is computed in January and June.

\*\*Special note regarding our ACT. Starting with the class of 2016, the Nevada Legislature added a College and Career Readiness exam to the requirements for high school graduation. In 2019 this was the ACT test. This means we had every student test most in their junior year, regardless of their post-high school plans, and lowered our average scores.

\*\* Note regarding the SAT: Less than 10 students took this exam in the 2023-2024 school year; unable to present compiled data.

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## Post High School Placement

- 35% matriculated to 2-year institutions
- 40% selected work, military service or technical instruction
