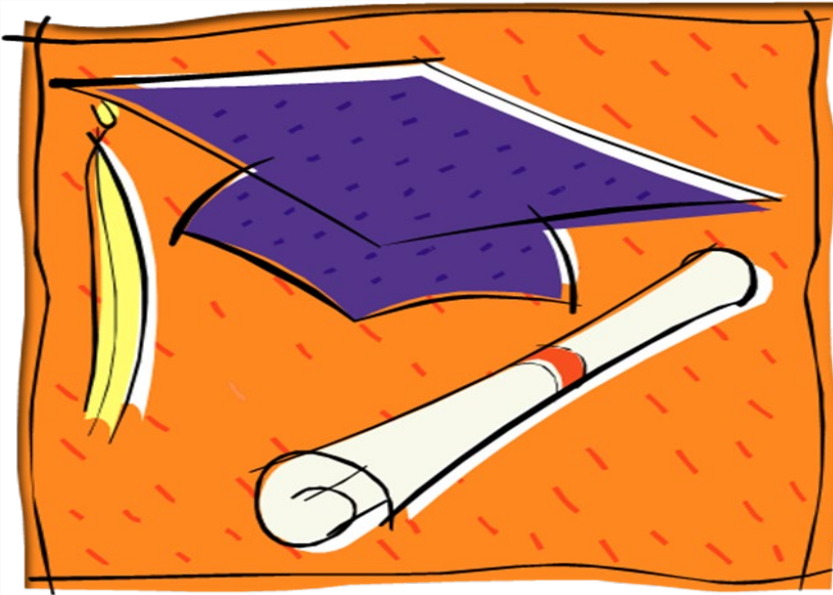

# Diploma Requirements & Options



**Standard:** 23 for the class of 2022+

- Flex credits can be:
  - a 2nd or 3rd year CTE completer course in one program of study,
  - a 4th year of math (including Alg 2 or higher), or
  - a 3rd year of science, or
  - a 4th year of social studies

► **\*\*NEW CHANGE FOR CLASS OF 2023\*\***

- $\frac{1}{2}$  credit of Government and  $\frac{1}{2}$  credit of Economics

**Advanced:** 3.25 GPA (24 credits)

**Honors:**

- 3.40 GPA (24 credits)
- **8** credits of honors classes
- 2 years of the same world language
- 2 years of lab science (Bio, Chem or Physics)

# College Admission Requirements

Minimum 3.0 Core GPA

SAT and ACT scores are no longer required for admission but can be used for class placement

Many colleges require 2 years same foreign language and 1 year of visual/performing art

**UNR:** English (4 credits)  
Math (3 credits- through Algebra 2)  
Social Studies (3 credits)  
Science (3 credits- two lab sciences)

**TMCC:** NO Minimum GPA Requirement.  
Anybody can apply for admission.

## **Out of State:**

Research college admission requirements early.

# College Planning Tips

## WHAT ARE MOST COLLEGES LOOKING FOR?

- ▶ GPA
- ▶ Some may require test scores
- ▶ Class rank
- ▶ Volunteer Work/Community Service (quality vs. quantity)
- ▶ Activities, clubs, athletics, awards- leadership!
- ▶ Evidence of special talent
- ▶ Employment
- ▶ First generation college student
- ▶ Essays/Letters of Recommendation
- ▶ Interviews/Auditions/Portfolios (more common for private schools, performing arts or fine arts programs)

- NCAA does **not** accept CBE, Edgenuity, or some BYU courses:

- ▶ Two different activities under 10 minutes to give you a great idea of what to expect with costs of living.

- ▶ 1. Choose your lifestyle- Budget how much money you'll need

You will be asked a series of questions to help you determine the lifestyle you want to lead and how much it will cost you. When you are finished you can look at occupations that might support that lifestyle.

- ▶ 2. Pick your salary-Budget from a starting salary
