# This Class

We are looking at US History starting after the Civil War up to today.

- Inquiry Based Learning: Our year is based around answering one question. Each unit has a Unit Question that helps to answer the Year Question, and each lesson has a Lesson Question that helps to answer the Unit Question. This gives students context as we progress through the year, helps them identify what is key information, and is what assessments are based around.
- Late Work policy: I do not deduct points for late work. Students may turn in work for full credit up to 2 weeks before the end of the grading period. This is to allow students who are out for extended periods or who have extenuating circumstances time to get all of their work in without penalty.
- Grading Scale: Assessments are the majority of the grade in this class. My office hours are lunch and after school by appointment. If a student does not feel ready for an assessment, I encourage them to come see me and we will work together until they are ready.
- Teams! Everyday in the “posts” section of Teams I put what we did in class that day (lesson question, what we did, and homework). In the files section, I upload any materials (presentations, worksheets, videos, etc) that we used. Students and parents may refer here for any questions about what we are doing in class. If a student is absent, they can use Teams to find everything they missed in class. My hope is this will help students out for extended periods to not fall behind.

Today, we began with a presentation and 2 readings on African Americans in the north. Then we read some examples of Race Riots/modernism in cities through history and filled out a worksheet with that information.
