Rex describes the Glass Castle in the following description. "It would have a glass ceiling and thick glass walls and even a glass staircase. The Glass Castle would have solar cells on the top that would catch the sun's rays and convert them into electricity for heating and cooling and running all the appliances. It would even have its own water purification system. Dad had worked out the architecture and the floor plans and most of the mathematical calculations. He carried around the blueprints for the Glass Castle wherever we went, and sometimes he'd pull them out and let us work on the design for our rooms."

This is also the title of the novel. What do you feel that the glass castle represents? Explain why it is important to Rex and the Walls?



On page 71 of The Glass Castle, the reader is struck with an intense fight between Rex and Rosemary that escalated from a shouting contest to a full-fledged fight that almost got Rosemary killed. How do you think this incident affected the Walls children? Do you think that this incident was traumatic enough to justify the Walls children being taken away from Rex and Rosemary? If you witnessed this situation, what would you do?

Moving around can have a big impact on people. In <u>The</u> Glass Castle, the Walls family is always on the move. The kids discuss how they don't bother making friends outside of their family. In what other ways do you think that transiency has affected different characters in the text?



Pick a scene from in the book that you have read so far. First explain what happens in the scene in one sentence. Then, pick a character other than the narrator, Jeanette Walls, and filter the scene through this character's lens. What was this character thinking? What might have been details he/ she focused on instead? What would have been his or her viewpoint on the events that occurred?






"I couldn't believe I'd been sitting here thinking of Grandma Smith, looking forward to eating Cream of Wheat and having her comb my hair and cuss, and all along she'd been dead. I started hitting Mom on the shoulder, hard, and asking why she hasn't told us. Finally, Dad held down my fists with his free hand, the other holding both his cigarette and the steering wheel, and said, 'That's enough, Mountain Goat'" (Walls 92).

What was your reaction to this moment in the novel? Did you relate it to anything from your own life? What's the best way to tell a child someone they love has died?




How do you think Jeanette felt after seeing Rex started drinking again? On page 123, she doesn't elaborate much about how she feels when this happens.



On page 86, Jeanette is told she was "raped" by Billy. On page 87, Jeanette deals with processing and understanding what happened. Go back and re-read these portions of the text.

She decides not to tell anyone. How might Rex have acted if he found out? How would Jeanette's life be different (or the same) if she spoke up?



Complete a character sketch of Rex Walls:

What has the author revealed about her brother Brian so far in the novel?

The reader learns very little about Brian's experiences in the first half of the novel. Why do you think this is? What do you think is Brian's experience from what you have read so far?



On page 115, it reads, "'Let's really light up this Christmas,' Dad said and thrust the lighter into the Douglas fir."

In moments, weeks of hard work and joy for the Walls' family was ruined. Why do you think no one in the Walls' family lashed out at Rex? How would you have reacted? What does the children and Rosemary's reaction reveal?



On page 103, Jeanette is assaulted. Go back to this page and re-read the account quickly. How does normalizing traumatic events impact a person's sense of self? How did this event effect Jeanette?



On page 103 it reads, "One night when I was almost 10, I was awakened by someone running his hands over my private parts." Re-read this scene on page 103. How would you have reacted if you were in Jeanette's place? Did Brian do the right thing? Are Jeanette's parents to blame for the incident: her dad for being out or her mom who was sleeping in the next room over? How might you react if your child endured this? How does this incident clarify or question your view of Jeanette and her family?

"He told me I was his favorite child, but he made me promise not to tell Lori or Brian or Maureen. It was our secret" (Walls 78).

According to a 2005 study, perceived parental favoritism can result in low self-esteem, anxiety, and depression in both the alleged "favorite child" and their siblings. Yet, research also suggests that over 65% of parents report having a favorite.

Reflect on why Jeanette may be Rex's favorite and what effect this may have on her and her siblings. Even though she was sworn to secrecy, do you think her siblings can tell?

Do you think parents are wrong to have "a favorite child"? Can it be avoided?
