Subject: [EXTERNAL] Facemask Policy for 2021/2022 School Year

Hello,

My name is Melissa Gabler and I have two children, ages 9 and 7 that reside in the WCSD. I am asking you to please follow the same reopening plans as Carson City School District regarding the wearing of facemasks for the 2021/2022 school year! This will still allow parents the **option** to send their student to school in a face mask if they choose to do so but **will not require them** for all students.

Thank you for your time and consideration.

1. The Wearing of facemasks is **not required** for the 2021-2022 School Year. The following situations should be considered:
 - a. Carson City School District highly encourages the use of facemasks for unvaccinated persons over the age of 2 years of age. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/schools-childcare/k-12-guidance.html> The District has a supply of available facemasks to staff, students, and volunteers who desire to wear a facemask in District buildings and vehicles.
 - b. If a localized outbreak of COVID-19 or a variant of COVID-19 occurs, the temporary use of facemasks may be employed as part of a multi-layered effort to end the outbreak.
 - c. COVID-19 vaccinations are available at no cost to all staff, volunteers, and age-appropriate students. A COVID-19 vaccination is not required to enroll in, attend school, or to be employed by the District.
 - d. Staff, volunteers, students, and families may voluntarily wear facemasks in any district building or vehicle.

Dear WCSD board,

Students starting school in the Fall need to be wearing masks. The Academy of Pediatrics is currently recommending that everyone over the age of 2, regardless of vaccination status, wear masks in schools. We need to protect all children including vulnerable children in school settings. In addition to the Academy of Pediatrics, the CDC also advises that masks should be worn indoors by all individuals (age 2 and older) who are not fully vaccinated. Dr. Fauci, the nation's top infectious disease expert is also stating that mask wearing in schools should be followed. At the end of the school year last year, a group of local pediatricians wrote a letter to the WCSD recommending that students continue to wear masks during school. Our child's pediatrician signed and supported this letter, and it is still her opinion that masks should be worn in school. With new variants emerging it is more important than ever for our students to be wearing masks in school. I am very concerned to send my daughter to school this fall without masks being mandatory. The WCSD needs to provide a safe environment for all children during this pandemic by reinstating the mask mandate for the 2021-2022 school year. It would be reckless to not have students wearing masks. The guidance of these accredited institutions and professionals should not be overlooked. Our children's lives depend on it.

I am the mother of two children currently enrolled in WCSD. Although parts of two consecutive school years have been marred by COVID restrictions, it is critical for the mental well-being of our children that a third year does not contain pointless regulation pertaining to a virus that does not affect children in any significant manner.

Earlier this month, the CDC recommended that school districts across the country mandate unvaccinated children to continue to wear masks and socially distance themselves from other children. Dear Washoe County School Board of Trustees,

It's time to make masks optional for staff and students. I have two children currently attending WCSD and my family is opposed to forced masking.

Regardless of whether or not you believe masks work, it comes down to this: somebody needs to provide a logical objective that serves as the basis for the new mask mandates. What will be accomplished via new mask mandates?

Save the health care system? Nope. Flatten the curve? Not at this point.

Kids are too low of risk from Covid and vaccines are available to anyone who wants one, 12+, for masks to be of any use.

Are you attempting to buy time? For what, and why?

When masks were mostly removed in May 2021 in Washoe County schools, the case rate in our community went down over 50% over the next 6 weeks. You already proved that masks didn't matter then. Why would they matter now?

It is time to go back to normal.

Masking will lead to a loss of trust, and a growing demand for school vouchers.

And when you realize that about half the country went back to school maskless last year with no adverse consequences, this new mandate is even more unneeded.

The reality is that almost everyone has already been exposed, deaths are down over 70% from 2020 to 2021, we are already at or near seasonal peak, and the burden to show masks work in schools has never been presented. In fact, this study shows masks actually made the spread worse: [COVID-19 Mitigation Practices and COVID-19 Rates in Schools: Report on Data from Florida, New York and Massachusetts \(medrxiv.org\)](#) (Screenshot and typed out link below)

Even the American Association of Pediatrics' recommendation to mask toddlers and up does not cite one piece of data, but they do link to teachers' unions websites. (hint: it was a political lobbying piece to get more federal funds, it was not a scientific document)

One year ago, Kevin Dick told you he predicted "Dark Days Ahead" if you allowed school to open for in person. You ignored him, and you were right. Cases literally dropped for the first two months of school began. He was wrong, but that didn't stop him from trying to repeatedly scare you and shut you down.

Fear has long been the tool of the authoritarian. They use it for one simple reason: it works. Fear deranges a people. It shuts off rational function and leaves the lizard limbic brain in charge rendering the frightened unable to see nuance or reason and desperate to hear and abide by simple commands to action dispensed by loud, shouty people.

Fear drives a need for conformity and safety in the herd. This is why so much of the governmental messaging on covid and other topics is about fear and not about reason. It's why the "experts" never give us a cost benefit analysis. It's pop-psychology and message manipulation because that's what works on the herd. At this point, masks are simply a tool of fear.

It's why they repeat the mask lie over and over, so you see it everywhere. They do not provide facts, they provide quantity. This is not epidemiology, it's manipulation.

It is why they vilify and gaslight opposition to masking and call them deniers and disinformers.

The pro-mask people are all about monopolizing the message and repeating it everywhere. (it's also why Coke and Pepsi spend so much on ads despite every living human already knowing what their products are. If you stop the repetition, people think you disappeared.)

But truth is leaking out bit by bit because not everyone stands down. Not everyone is irrational. And when this happens, the quiet ones in the unseen majority realize they are not alone.

As fear fades and rationality returns, those voices gain currency and more people begin to actually hear them. They wonder "Was I in the wrong herd? Did I get this wrong?"

The more who flip, the easier it is for the next ones to follow because the new herd begins to look big and safe.

Reject the Kevin Dick style "lie 'till you comply" tactics. They cannot allow the other side to speak or to convince, not because it's wrong, but because it's correct and as that knowledge spreads, the state of the herd's view will flip.

No one talks about Sweden anymore. Why? Kids stayed in school unmasked the whole time. Restrictions were limited. Their 14 day average for Covid deaths is currently 0. As I write this, Washoe County's 14 day death average is less than 1. There are no longer justifications for emergency measures.

And yet the "casedemic" of non-clinical and non-threatening positive high Ct PCR tests is all the media speaks of. It's tales of terror, denial of summer seasonality for covid (just like last year), demands for closures, restrictions, masks, and more grift, graft, and tyranny. And it's easy to get lost in that. It's easy to over-focus on it. But don't because there is one very important difference between this summer and last summer:

No rational parents think covid restrictions still matter. Parents are not sending their kids back to school because they are scared. They are doing it because they want their kids to have normal healthy lives.

Masks are not normal and anyone who says they are is lying. Almost every aspect of life in the United States has returned to relative normal. Given how low the risk is for kids, schools must do the same. Anything else is child abuse.





Dear WCSD Trustees and Superintendent Dr. McNeil,

As always, thank you for your service and continued dedication and support of our schools and community. I appreciate your time and willingness to serve in these challenging times.

As a parent of a WCSD 1st grader, I implore you to please reconsider universal masking for grades K-12 to align with the recommendations of the CDC and the American Association of Pediatrics (AAP). I agree that the policy considerations should be aimed at keeping all students safe and present in school as much as possible.

On a personal level, my daughter is desperate to join her classmates in-person next year. I can't imagine having to disenroll her from her zoned school community to go to Northstar online because the district made a decision to ignore the professional, scientific guidance from the CDC. Northstar is an option that is NOT appropriate for many students for various reasons including socioeconomic, family involvement, and learning ability. The community **needs schools to stay OPEN and provide a consistent, and safe environment for learning.**

The following is an excerpt from the AAP recommendations:

"All students older than 2 years and all school staff should wear face masks at school (unless medical or developmental conditions prohibit use).

The AAP recommends universal masking in school at this time for the following reasons:

- ***a significant portion of the student population is not eligible for vaccination***
- protection of unvaccinated students from COVID-19 and to reduce transmission
- lack of a system to monitor vaccine status among students, teachers and staff
- potential difficulty in monitoring or enforcing mask policies for those who are not vaccinated; in the absence of schools being able to conduct this monitoring, universal masking is the best and most effective strategy to create consistent messages, expectations, enforcement, and compliance without the added burden of needing to monitor vaccination status
- possibility of low vaccination uptake within the surrounding school community
- ***continued concerns for variants that are more easily spread among children, adolescents, and adults.***

I am a parent of two boys who attend Lenz Elementary School. I have a masters in Education and teach high school at a charter school in Reno. I attended Washoe County schools from the time I was in Kindergarten until I graduated from Galena High School in 2004. My family's roots run deep in the school district as many of you may have been hired by or knew my grandfather, Deloy Anderson, the former principal, teacher, coach, and Superintendent of Personnel at Washoe County School District.

I am writing today to express my extreme disapproval to mask our children during the upcoming school year. Not only do I believe that the masks cause major health issues in children, it is also proven that children misuse the masks consistently, making their effectiveness next to zero. As a high school teacher, I can tell you I have observed children in my classes sucking on their masks, spitting into their masks, putting their masks on the floor, etc. and these are 14 year old students! Dear Board of Trustees,

I wanted to take a moment to write about the upcoming decision regarding Covid-19 mitigation measures for the 2021-2022 school year. I have three children enrolled in WCSD this year—one entering kindergartener, one entering 9th grade, and one entering 10th grade.

The Covid mitigation measures put into place during the 2020-2021 school year has had a significant negative impact on our children. I witnessed the impact with not only my own children but many others. As I'm sure you're aware, there has been an increase in anxiety and depression in our children which has lead to suicide in some cases. But even the children who haven't been driven to such drastic measures experienced varying degrees of hardship as a result of the WCDS safety measures last year, leaving children with feels of isolation and loneliness.

When considering whether or not our children should be required to wear masks and social distance, we must consider not only transmission of Covid but the fallout these requirements have on children. My husband and I pulled one of our daughters out of the district altogether last year as a result of the social and emotional problems she was experiencing as a result of the mask and social distance mandate. And that says nothing of her academic hardship which reduced a straight A student to an F student in a matter of weeks. Our other daughter struggled last year as well, choosing the full distance model after failing to interact with friends under the hybrid model. I have seen and heard of many children crying daily because of mask wearing and social distancing. I know children who were unable to make or have even one friend at school. I know children who were unable to interact effectively with the friends they do have. I know children who struggled to breathe while wearing masks for extended periods of time. I know children who feared getting into trouble if they removed their mask, even when the mask was completely and totally soiled with saliva and nasal discharge. Clearly, things must change.

Children go to school to learn academics, but school is also a place where children should be learning the social and emotional skills needed to become healthy, productive members of our society. The next generation is already socially challenged due to the use of technology, but the affect has been compounded with a year and a half of mask wearing and social distancing. We were created to be in healthy community, and school should be one of the most prominent places children find that community.

Mask wearing and social distancing should be a personal decision. Families are more than capable of choosing whether or not they would like to wear masks. Each family has unique circumstances that may influence their decision, but the decision should remain theirs.

I am hopeful the 2021-2022 school year will be significantly better than last year. It is my hope and prayer that our children can return to a healthy learning environment where their social, emotional, and mental health take priority. But much of that depends on the decisions you make at the next board meeting. Will you continue to sacrifice the social, emotional, and mental health of our children to mitigate the spread of Covid after a vaccine has been made available to all who want one and considering the fact that the impact on children is relatively minimal? Please, for the sake of our children, I ask that you do not require mask wearing or social distancing for the 2021-2022 school year. Let our children return to school as normal. Let them be kids. Let them see one another's smiles once again—the smiles of their teachers—and let them feel normal.

Dear WCSD Board of Trustees,

Thank you for taking the time to read my message and my opinion regarding the requirement for masks for children and vaccinated staff. The superintendent recently released her recommendations for schools opening in the coming weeks and I support her recommendations for students in grade 3 and below the option to wear masks.

I do acknowledge that the positivity rate has increased over the past few weeks. As of 7/23, Washoe County had been flagged for an elevated COVID-19 rate. I'm aware that some of the pediatricians in our community and country recommend EVERYONE in schools wear masks regardless of vaccination status. I have also read and acknowledge the CDC guidelines regarding masks for unvaccinated students in schools. However, our county data, as of 7/23, shows 1,236 active cases. In a population size of 478,155. That is less than 1% (0.0026414 to be exact). <https://www.washoecounty.us/health/programs-and-services/ephp/communicable-diseases-and-epidemiology/educational-materials/COVID-19.php> Unfortunately for more specific use, there is no posted data stating if any of these 1,236 cases are children aged 5-19.

While pediatricians, scientists, and our superintendent (while following the Governor's directive) are making these recommendations I am left to wonder if the benefits of mask wearing for ALL children outweigh the benefits of their learning, social and emotional needs. As the superintendent states, one of the guiding principals is "do no harm", I believe and have seen that masks for most students can do harm. Pediatricians say they focus on and are concerned with the well-being of the whole child, yet none of these pediatricians (to my knowledge) have spoken to an educator about what they see daily in their classrooms when children wear masks.

Mask recommendations and social distancing guidelines restrict peer interaction and limit language development. Having a mask covering a teacher's face limits a child's ability to see how certain sounds and words are formed. It limits their ability to hear clear directions. Having a mask cover children's faces limits their willingness to engage with each other and the teacher. Having a mask covering a teacher's and children's faces doesn't allow for children to read facial expressions. All of this delays language development and decreases positive peer interaction and relationships. Limiting interaction by enforcing social distancing, not allowing the use of shared materials, and mask wearing is detrimental to their growth, relationships, and education.

I would like to ask scientists, members of COVID task forces, members of the board of trustees, district, county and city administration and pediatricians this: Have you been able to see a child's face when they are asked a question and are told to "speak louder" or "project their voice"? It's heartbreaking. They may already be unsure of themselves and we are forcing them to speak louder because of masks. This can result in embarrassment, refusal to participate, lack of engagement, or eventually give them anxiety about speaking.

Please consider allowing vaccinated teachers the option to wear or not wear masks. Please consider revising the use of masks for all children PreK-High School. Dear Trustee's,

Please consider moving into the 2021-2022 school year with masks being optional for all students and not mandated by the board. There is scientifically no data to back up the idea that masking children in our schools leads to any further safety or lower transmission rates among students and adults.

Although it can be scary for our country to see a rise in cases at various times throughout the year, as a parent, I believe that masking our children is not the correct answer to combat this. Even though cases have been rising, serious cases and deaths are not following that rise. We are currently down 71% from last year's death rates and hospitalization is down 50%. This virus (although a concern) is no longer a national emergency in the same sense that it was at the peak last year.

Even at that peak, masking children is impractical and has never been successfully backed up by the data and research. And the long term implications for social emotional learning are something we will be seeing effects of for years to come.

3. Masking, distancing, and otherwise harassing school age kids didn't stop them from getting infected. The CDC burden estimates show 41.5% of all kids age 5 to 17 had already been infected by March 2021. It's probably well over 50% now. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/cases-updates/burden.html>

Even if vaccines are 97% effective, mortality risk for *unvaccinated* children is lower than vaccinated adults over 30. 100x lower than vaccinated adults over 75. **No mitigation measure can be justified as "for the children," ever.**

For these reasons and many more we urge you to reconsider before sending our kids into another year of subdued education with a lack of ability to emotionally connect through verbal and facial cues. This is doing far more harm than their small amount of virus transmission rates will do. Especially for the Jr. High and high school kids who need those connections to remain healthy and stable through their education experience.

There simply is no logic in this recommendation. It does not make sense why children who are less likely to transmit COVID to adults must wear a mask. My name is Shannon Sinner, and I am writing in response to the recommendations set forth by Superintendent Kristin McNeill for the upcoming school year.

I received the link to the recent article on the KOLO website from a friend. I was astonished and distressed, especially to see that this article was published 7/23/21 nowhere to be found otherwise.

Our children are enjoying their summer to the best of their ability after the most turbulent, inconsistent, and saddening year overall. To say they have been affected is a gross understatement. I work with children in care, am a Psychosocial Rehabilitation worker and parent of 2. Our youth lost all normalcy, consistency, and the ability to feel safe educationally, mentally, and emotionally last year. We, as parents are working with so many new normals, then throw a mask on our children's faces. They have been forced to rewire their emotional response. They squint/stare and space out in class, struggle with social norms with their peers and are constantly looking at their educators for safety and for any kind of comfort in an uncertain world. I have watched my children, who have relied on and trusted their educators, struggle with adapting to this new classroom setting. Keep in mind, my 3rd grader had desk shields last year, wore a mask and was unable to play with his 3 best friends since kindergarten, who were in the class that was NEXT DOOR to his classroom. My daughter was a champion all accounts, finished her last year at elementary school with smiles, after beginning the year with serious uncertainty and stress. She wondered if she could even talk to her friends, in person, after 6 months of not being able to do so, as they were required to wear masks and be 6 ft apart. STRESS? Why should our children feel stress at school that is unrelated to educational challenges? School is meant to be a safe place for our youth. The way our last school year was handled was so saddening, not just because of the pandemic, but due to the inconsistencies and push for the kids to "adapt to the new normal" which was uncertain and changed every few weeks.

The last 2 months of the school year were the greatest blessing for my children. Removing the masks OFF our children 10 and under when indoors and at recess, thank goodness it's about time! How is wearing a mask healthy while exercising outdoors? Unfortunately, my daughter is now 12 and was not afforded the same-masks off only at recess or while eating for the last 2 month of school.

Many people got vaccinated against their own gut feeling, did it for public safety, along with their own AND THE REQUIREMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS of the employer. As a Washoe County School District parent I implore you, please, make our children's safety and health your highest priority and mandate masks to be worn by all Individuals within the school building regardless of vaccination status.

I ask you this upon the advise of the Center for Disease Control and Prevention and the American Academy of Pediatrics.

The CDC key takeaways for K-12 schools include

- Masks should be worn indoors by all individuals (age 2 or older) who are not fully vaccinated.
- CDC recommends schools maintain at least 3 feet of physical distance between students within classrooms, combined with indoor mask wearing by people who are not fully vaccinated, to reduce transmission risk.

American Academy of Pediatrics recommends universal masking in school at this time for the following reasons:

- a significant portion of the student population is not eligible for vaccination
- protection of unvaccinated students from COVID-19 and to reduce transmission
- potential difficulty in monitoring or enforcing mask policies for those who are not vaccinated; in the absence of schools being able to conduct this monitoring, universal masking is the best and most effective strategy to create consistent messages, expectations, enforcement, and compliance without the added burden of needing to monitor vaccination status
- continued concerns for variants that are more easily spread among children, adolescents, and adults

I ask you mandate masks for all Individuals in school buildings based on current COVID-19 data from the Washoe County Health District. According to their own COVID data tracker, cases within the community are on the rise. These cases include the Delta variant which has been shown to breakthrough to vaccinated individuals. Washoe County is consistency recording the same amount of new COVID cases as we did in May and June of 2020. Masks were mandated in schools in 2020 and I ask that you do the same in 2021 based on data, science, and advise from our medical professionals.

NOTICE OF LIABILITY URGENT ACTION REQUIRED

RE: Masks in School

We are the parents of WCSD students. I am writing to you to express my grave concerns regarding the compulsory use of face masks in schools. It has come to my attention that there are widely known hazards, health risks and dangers associated with the use of face masks, which can result in both physical and psychological harm to the user. It is reasonable to expect that you have considered such issues carefully, and familiarized yourself with the available evidence, prior to making a decision to compel pupils in your care to wear masks.

However, insofar as you may not have done so to date, I wish to draw these issues to your attention, and I call upon you to take immediate remedial action. Please be advised that I am also of the view that compelling my child to wear a face mask is a direct violation of their right to bodily integrity and/or personal autonomy, and thus constitutes an abuse. For the avoidance of any doubt, I object to my child being subjected to such abuse and call for an end to same forthwith. SCIENTIFIC AND MEDICAL DATA Enclosed herewith for your immediate perusal is abundant evidence demonstrating the health risks associated with face masks. Please refer to the enclosed Appendix.

In light of the available scientific and medical data, it is evident that face masks constitute a hazard and pose a risk and/or danger to the health and well-being of your pupils, including my child. 2 DUTY OF CARE I would respectfully draw your attention to the legal duties under law owed to my child whilst on your premises and/or in your care. Duties also arise in the context of the school/pupil relationship and/or out of an assumption of responsibility based on knowledge of potential dangers and/or risks and/or hazards in the school environment, such as those highlighted above. I would respectfully point out that the consequences of ignoring this scientific and medical data and continuing to implement a compulsory mask policy would constitute a dereliction of your duty of care and has the potential to cause harm or injury to my child.

I would, therefore, call upon you to take this Notice seriously and afford it the attention it deserves. REQUIRED ACTION In light of the above, and based on the Precautionary Principle as enshrined in law, I urge you to take all necessary action to prevent any further harm to my child with immediate effect.

In that regard, I hereby call upon you to take the following actions forthwith:

1. Place an immediate ban on the compulsory use of face masks in your school. Please be advised that I object to my child being subjected to such requirements and demand an immediate end to any compulsion to wear any such items while at school;
2. Confirm by return, in writing, that you will immediately cease and desist from compelling my child to wear a face mask in your school;
3. Furnish me with a copy of all risk assessments carried out by your school in connection with face masks;
4. Provide confirmation by return that your staff and teachers, including such individuals you have placed in charge of my child, have been fully trained in connection with the health risks associated with face masks, including with regards to recognizing the health contra-indications from the use of same.

TAKE NOTICE: Any failure on your part to take immediate action to address and remedy the matters outlined above will render such inaction highly irresponsible, and potentially damaging

to my child. If 3 any harm befalls my child as a result of your acts and omissions, you and/or your school shall be held liable for same. TAKE FURTHER NOTE: As you have been placed on notice of the foregoing grave and serious issues regarding face masks, any failure to take action, as a consequence of your position and remit, may also expose you to personal liability in law, for any adverse health effects suffered by my child as a result of your acts and/or omissions.

WARNING: For the avoidance of any doubt, if you fail to respond to this letter as requested, or fail to take the actions outlined above, I shall have no alternative but to take such further steps as may be necessary, including by way of legal action, in order to protect the health and well-being of my child. If legal action becomes necessary, I shall rely on the contents of this letter at an appropriate time to seek to fix you with an order for the costs of an incidental to same. I would suggest you bring this letter to the attention of your insurance provider, and I would be obliged if you would kindly furnish me with their contact details. Due to the urgency of this matter, I look forward to your response by return.

Dear Superintendent McNeill and WCSD Board of Trustees,

The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) just put out new recommendations regarding in-person learning and masking requirements. Now is not the time to go against the science and medical experts, as you did with the current WCSD masking recommendations, for our vulnerable children 11 and under, who are unable to get the covid-19 vaccination. Why would you let this population go unmasked, yet require masks for children 12 and older who are fully vaccinated?

The AAP is recommending that "all students older than two years old and all school staff wear face masks at school (unless medical or developmental conditions prohibit use)." Yet again, you choose to ignore expert recommendations and science, and you go rogue and recommend children in fourth grade and below go unmasked. If you are going to go rogue, it should at least follow the science, which would be that students 12 and older and staff who are fully vaccinated do not need to wear face masks.

The AAP makes its universal masking recommendations because a significant portion of the student population is not eligible for the vaccination; to protect unvaccinated students from covid-19 and reduce transmission; lack of a system to monitor vaccine status among students, teachers, and staff; potential difficulty in monitoring or enforcing mask policies for those who are not vaccinated; possibility of low vaccination uptake within the surrounding school community; and continued concerns for variants that are more easily spread among children, adolescents, and adults.

As Washoe County sees a rise in the Delta variant, which is more easily spread than covid-19, your role is to protect one of our most vulnerable populations = children who are not eligible for vaccination. Your role is not to put their lives at risk by going against science, expert national and local medical recommendations, and public health data related to community spread, vaccination rates, hospitalizations, and deaths.

As such, I urge you to do the following:

1. Require universal masking for in-person learning for all students, teachers, and staff; do not exempt students, teachers, and staff in the fourth grade and below.
2. If you are not going to require universal masking, at least follow the science, and allow students 12 years and older, teachers, and staff who are fully vaccinated to go unmasked.
3. Require the covid-19 vaccination for those students eligible in the suite of vaccinations required to attend school.
4. Require all teachers and staff to get vaccinated.
5. Read the AAP recommendations (available at [services.aap.org](https://www.aap.org/services)); read Dr. John Hess's, a local Reno doctor, Facebook posts (available to the public on Facebook); and read "5 Things to know about the Delta Variant" (available on [yalemedicine.org](https://www.yalemedicine.org) = Delta is more contagious than other virus strains; Unvaccinated people are at risk; Delta could lead to hyperlocal outbreaks; There is still more to learn about Delta; Vaccination is the best protection against Delta).

Dear Board of Trustees,

I am submitting my public comment today as both an elementary educator in WCSD and a concerned community member in regards to the recommendations being provided today from Superintendent McNeill to continue the current policy of unvaccinated students age 9 and younger to not have a mask mandate as we head into the 2021 school year. This proposal from the Superintendent goes against ALL recommendations from local, national, and global health experts and is reckless and dangerous as our community faces a steady increase of Covid-19 cases in the wake of the delta variant.

-The World Health Organization recently urged for everyone globally, regardless of vaccine status, to wear masks indoors in response to the delta variant.

-The CDC guidelines for school openings say that masks should be worn indoors by anyone who is over the age of 2 and is not yet fully vaccinated, while the American Academy of Pediatrics takes this guideline even further recommending masks for both children and adults regardless of vaccination status.

-Washoe County Health District's epidemiology program manager Heather Kerwin reiterated to the school district to follow the CDC recommendations that masks should be worn in crowded settings both indoors and outdoors by all unvaccinated persons.

-While the current governor's directive does not require masks to be worn by younger children, the directive does state "Children who are two to nine years of age are STRONGLY ENCOURAGED to wear face coverings in public spaces."

These recommended guidelines that come from disease experts on all levels, should not be lumped into the category of "differing opinions" on masks mandates within schools. Our community and school district needs our leadership to follow the appropriate science and base decisions on these expert recommendations to protect our students, families, staff, and entire Washoe community, especially as a more contagious variant that has proven to have more ill affect on younger populations has begun to spread throughout our community.

In addition, the current policy creates confusion and hardship for elementary educators and schools. Please review and consider the Carson City Board of Trustees approved 2021-2022 school year reopening plan as a balanced, methodical, and safe approach to the upcoming school year.

Reopening School Buildings and Grounds

All school buildings and grounds will be open to the public for the start of the 2021-2022 school year. The Governor has returned authority to local school officials to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. As such, Carson City School District will re-open schools, offices, and grounds for instructional, administrative, and extracurricular activities under the following conditions:

1. The school year will proceed according to the approved 2021-2022 School Year Calendar.
2. School will be in session five (5) days per week for in-person, on campus learning.
3. Full-time Remote Learning will be available by application through Pioneer Academy.
4. Students experiencing short-term absences (usually less than two (2) weeks in duration) will have access to remote learning through their school and teacher. The District will provide all enrolled students with Chromebooks and will assist families with internet connectivity on an as needed basis.
5. The Wearing of facemasks is not required for the 2021-2022 School Year. The following situations should be considered:
 - a. Carson City School District highly encourages the use of facemasks for unvaccinated persons over the age of 2 years of age. <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/schools-childcare/k-12-guidance.html> The District has a supply of available facemasks to staff, students, and volunteers who desire to wear a facemask in District buildings and vehicles.
 - b. If a localized outbreak of COVID-19 or a variant of COVID-19 occurs, the temporary use of facemasks may be employed as part of a multi-layered effort to end the outbreak.
 - c. COVID-19 vaccinations are available at no cost to all staff, volunteers, and age-appropriate students. A COVID-19 vaccination is not required to enroll in, attend school, or to be employed by the District.
 - d. Staff, volunteers, students, and families may voluntarily wear facemasks in any district building or vehicle.
6. Guidance and recommendations from the National Center of Disease Control (CDC) and local health authorities encourage the vaccination of age-appropriate persons against the COVID-19 virus and its variants.
7. Good hygiene and continued sanitation practices instituted in the previous school year including awareness of social distancing practices will be encouraged.

Please do not make decisions for the 2021-2022 school year based on FUD (Fear, Uncertainty, and Doubt). Our children have already endured the negative academic, emotional, mental, and physical hardships of such decisions previously. I kindly ask the WCSD Board of Trustees to take a measured and safe approach instituting remedial measures, such as mandating mask wearing for students and the like, if/when needed. Significant data has been compiled that illustrates the negative impact upon students that have been forced by school districts to wear masks for 7+ hours a day. To whom it may concern:

I am writing to express my opinion against the masking of the children and the vaccination. The masks are not protecting the children, they are in fact exposing them to serious health risks. Please see below a press release from Gainesville, Florida:

Gainesville, FL (June 16, 2021) – A group of parents in Gainesville, FL, concerned about potential harms from masks, submitted six face masks to a lab for analysis. The resulting report found that five masks were contaminated with bacteria, parasites, and fungi, including three with dangerous pathogenic and pneumonia-causing bacteria. No viruses were detected on the masks, although the test is capable of detecting viruses.

The analysis detected the following 11 alarmingly dangerous pathogens on the masks:

- Streptococcus pneumoniae (pneumonia)
- Mycobacterium tuberculosis (tuberculosis)
- Neisseria meningitidis (meningitis, sepsis)
- Acanthamoeba polyphaga (keratitis and granulomatous amebic encephalitis)
- Acinetobacter baumannii (pneumonia, blood stream infections, meningitis, UTIs—resistant to antibiotics)
- Escherichia coli (food poisoning)
- Borrelia burgdorferi (causes Lyme disease)
- Corynebacterium diphtheriae (diphtheria)
- Legionella pneumophila (Legionnaires' disease)
- Staphylococcus pyogenes serotype M3 (severe infections—high morbidity rates)
- Staphylococcus aureus (meningitis, sepsis)

Half of the masks were contaminated with one or more strains of pneumonia-causing bacteria. One-third were contaminated with one or more strains of meningitis-causing bacteria. One-third were contaminated with dangerous, antibiotic-resistant bacterial pathogens. In addition, less dangerous pathogens were identified, including pathogens that can cause fever, ulcers, acne, yeast infections, strep throat, periodontal disease, Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever, and more.

The face masks studied were new or freshly-laundered before wearing and had been worn for 5 to 8 hours, most during in-person schooling by children aged 6 through 11. One was worn by an adult. A t-shirt worn by one of the children at school and unworn masks were tested as controls. No pathogens were found on the controls. Proteins found on the t-shirt, for example, are not pathogenic to humans and are commonly found in hair, skin, and soil.

A parent who participated in the study, Ms. Amanda Donoho, commented that this small sample points to a need for more research: "We need to know what we are putting on the faces of our children each day. Masks provide a warm, moist environment for bacteria to grow."

These local parents contracted with the lab because they were concerned about the potential of contaminants on masks that their children were forced to wear all day at school, taking them on and off, setting them on various surfaces, wearing them in the bathroom, etc. This prompted them to send the masks to the University of Florida's Mass Spectrometry Research and Education Center for analysis.



The below chart, put together by the group of parents, shows the potential dangers from each pathogen:



Update: Some experts are casting doubt on the credibility of the above lab results, per AFP, one of Facebook's fact-checking partners. These experts include physicians at Johns Hopkins All Children's Hospital, as well as Dr. Benjamin Neuman, chair of the Biological Sciences department at Texas A&M University-Texarkana. Board members and superintendent,

The time for real leadership arrived long ago and you failed us all. That's water under the bridge at this point and I'm urging you with all the energy of my soul to get your act together and start doing the very thing you've been elected/hired to do: lead.

Children are not the problem. They are not spreading diseases that kill people. They are not at risk of killing each other with diseases. Nor are children maiming others with disease. This needs to be understood perfectly. It's time to stop pretending you're doing good things when you're not. I'm begging you to allow our children to attend school **with no mask mandates in place.** You've been confusing this mask situation the entire time and asking the wrong question. The question is most certainly **not:** "Do masks work?" What we really want to know is this: "Do mask mandates work?" These are very different questions. If you think that mask mandates work, I can assure you that you are on the wrong side of science. **Mask mandates do not do what advocates think they do. Period.**

Professionally I deliver patient care in a setting that produces aerosols from the oral cavity in abundance. Over the 20 years I've spent in my profession it has always been the case that our masks and gloves absolutely do not protect us from viruses and bacteria. Intact human skin and our immune systems protect us. The biggest risk my profession faces is percutaneous inoculation of bloodborne pathogens (and masks and gloves provide ZERO protection from this). Even ASTM Level 3 barriers do not protect from airborne viruses. Despite the vulnerability I voluntarily experience daily at the office, with patients hacking and coughing and spitting who-knows-what every single day, neither myself nor my employees nor my colleagues and their employees across the nation and globe experience higher incidence of respiratory illnesses. Said another way, in a severe aerosol-producing environment with heavy surface contamination and direct, hands-on contact with the bodily fluids of a dozen or more different patients EVERY SINGLE DAY, my profession experiences ZERO increase in illness. Hopefully you recognize as I do that sometimes, zero is a very large number!

You might ask, "What's the big deal? What's the harm in masking our children, even if the benefit is questionable?" I'll answer these questions.

- 1) What our children are being forced to do with masks does not make them safe. The masks are not impervious to viruses. Especially when they've been worn day after day, stuffed into pockets and backpacks, and are adjusted and pulled at and touched constantly. If anything, wearing masks, especially for children, encourages them to touch their face more. Thus, **in forcing the children to wear masks we are LYING to them.** We are misleading them.
- 2) Masking kills human connection. Does the school board and the esteemed superintendent with a doctorate degree in education honestly think we send our kids to school to learn? We send them to be socialized primarily, and secondarily they learn many things along the way. Masking kills this primary function of school. You all read the news. You likely have inside numbers and data the general public does not have. You know our children are suffering. They are depressed and the incidence of self-harm and suicide is skyrocketing (and how much unreported self-harm is out there?). You can do something about this directly: **do not require masks.**

I have six children and five are enrolled in WCSD for this coming school year. My oldest should have been a high school senior this year but the district's restrictions made her school experience so stressful and unenjoyable this past year and

Good afternoon, my name is Katelyn and I wanted to voice my opinion regarding the mask mandate at schools for children. I worked in a kindergarten classroom January 2021 - May 2021 and saw the negative affects of children being forced to wear masks at school.

First off, the masks are more of a distraction than a safety precaution for young learners. I was constantly having to tell the students to take the mask out of their mouth, to stop playing with the straps, etc. Students would be getting up frequently to get water so that they could take their mask off for a brief second. This is just sad.

Secondly, it is extremely difficult to teach foundational skills such as phonological awareness and reading when the teacher and student have to have their mouths covered. When learning phonics and pronunciation of words, especially in kindergarten, students need to physically see how different letters and digraphs sound. With reading, students get interrupted because they are being asked to speak up because the teacher or aide cannot hear them through their masks. Instructors need to be able to clearly hear their student so they can correctly assess their progress.

Lastly, children are beginning to see a mask as part of their identity. A kindergartener was a drawing a self-portrait and told me, "Oh, I guess I have to draw a mask on myself. I am a rising high school senior in Washoe County, and I urge you to require facial coverings in schools for this upcoming fall semester.

Washoe County currently has a 'High Level of Community Transmission' [1] as defined by the Centers For Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and thus, fully vaccinated individuals are recommended to wear face coverings indoors [2]. Additionally, only 50.6% of individuals in Washoe County are fully vaccinated [3]. While it is fantastic to have that many people vaccinated, it is not yet enough to relax COVID-19 precautions in our schools. The CDC recommends unvaccinated individuals to wear face coverings indoors, regardless of the community transmission rate [4]. Based on these CDC guidelines, both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals should wear facial coverings indoors in Washoe County, and I strongly urge the board to follow these guidelines.

It is great for the board to have the goal of keeping students in in-person school. As a student, I have found the hybrid and distance models very challenging this past year due to the lack of in-person instruction. I absolutely support the decision for students to return to class full-time, but masks must be mandatory. Without COVID-19 prevention methods such as facemasks, the district is unnecessarily adding to the risk of increased covid transmission, and the possibility of eventually returning to a hybrid or distance model. To be frank, these online attendance models have a pronounced negative effect on my education. Masks do not. Dear Board of Trustees,

According to JAMA Pediatrics (published June 30, 2021), “The question whether nose and mouth covering increases carbon dioxide in inhaled air is crucial....Adverse effects in parents and children...has shown that 68% of the of the participating children had problems when wearing nose and mouth coverings....This is because of the dead-space volume of the masks, which collects exhaled carbon dioxide quickly after a short time. This carbon dioxide mixes with fresh air and elevates the carbon dioxide content of the inhaled air under the mask, and this was more pronounced in this study for younger children. ***This leads in turn to impairments attributable to hypercapnia.***”

***Hypercapnia Definition:** an abnormally high concentration of carbon dioxide in the blood, usually caused by acute respiratory failure from conditions such as asthma and obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD). It can lead to seizures and death if acute and untreated. It can also cause effects such as headaches, dizziness, fatigue, and loss of consciousness. It is often caused by hypoventilation where not enough oxygen enters the lungs and not enough carbon dioxide is emitted.

The following are considered symptoms of hypercapnia:

- * dizziness
- * drowsiness
- * excessive fatigue
- * headaches
- * feeling disoriented
- * flushing of the skin
- * shortness of breath
- * confusion
- * coma
- * depression or paranoia
- * hyperventilation
- * irregular heartbeat or arrhythmia
- * loss of consciousness
- * muscle twitching
- * panic attacks
- * seizures
- * death

“We suggest that decision-makers weigh the hard evidence produced by these experimental measurements accordingly, which suggests that children should not be forced to wear face masks.” JAMA Pediatrics June 30, 2021

Furthermore, all scientific studies agree, fine aerosols cannot be stopped by cloth or surgical masks. Researchers have shown that cloth masks can actually increase respiratory viral infections. As for N95 masks versus surgical masks, there is a difference in terms of side effects. The N95 mask filters out 95% of particles because it impairs respiratory exchange (breathing) to a greater degree than a surgical mask or cloth mask, and it is associated with more headaches. **The main cause of headaches when using an N95 mask is from hypoxia and hypercapnia.**

Additionally, researchers have measured blood oxygen levels of mask-wearers and found a significant drop in oxygen levels. The importance of this finding is that a drop in blood oxygen levels (hypoxia) is associated with an impairment in immunity.

“In essence, your mask may very well put you at an increased risk of infections.” (Russel Blaylock, MD)

I am a doctor, and wear a mask daily when treating my patients. I have been to OSHA meetings yearly for the past 20+ years. I understand exactly how masks work and don't work. Please follow the science and do NOT make recommendations that can and will cause serious health risks to our children. Masks pose serious health risks to children (and adults)!

Dear Trustees,

Thank you for your service on the board, especially during these extra challenging times. People should not be blaming the school board for the current situation with the Delta Variant. The Board is required to do what is in the best interest of the students under the current situation.

I hope you will take into account the most recent CDC Regulation recommending all students and staff wear masks, regardless of age and vaccination status. I originally felt that those who did not get vaccinated were putting themselves at risk and that did not affect me. However, as we have seen with the Delta Variant, it is rapidly spreading among those that are unvaccinated. This is how a virus works. It uses a host to spread and mutate. If we do not do something to stop the spread, we will soon be dealing with another variant. The more the virus mutates, the less likely the vaccine will be to prevent infection and we will end up back in the same situation as we were in the Fall of 2020 and Winter of 2021 before vaccines were available.

The decision by some members of our community to not get vaccinated has allowed the Delta variant to spread, putting our students education, extracurricular activities, our economy and mental well-being, and, most importantly, the health of our students and their families. I do not want to see our schools and community shut down again and requiring masks is a great compromise.

COVID 19 UPDATE!!!!!! PLEASE READ

Hello everyone, The CDC is going to announce two significant steps in trying to control the current outbreak of the Delta variant in the USA.

First, In areas of current high transmission (this includes Washoe Co!) all individuals whether vaccinated or not wear masks around others in indoor spaces until transmission rates fall to lower levels.

Second, all students, teachers and staff K-12 wear masks at all times while indoors in schools regardless of vaccination status. This follows the American Academy of Pediatrics who made this recommendation last week. I know that our own school district appears to be going against this recommendation by allowing those in the 3rd grade or below the option to not wear masks. I'm not exactly sure on where that guidance is coming from other than data previously indicated that small children were much less likely to spread COVID than teens and adults. That data however was based on earlier versions of the virus and Delta is 2-4 times more transmissible than the earlier versions and produces viral loads 1000 times more than prior versions. There is now ample evidence that small children can spread disease quite efficiently. That being said I believe if a child has mental or physical disabilities that makes wearing mask difficult exceptions should absolutely be made.

So why the change in recommendations.

First, we are seeing more symptomatic breakthrough cases in the vaccinated. The data out of Israel is pretty clear that those vaccinated are losing a moderate degree of protection from previously. The protection against symptomatic disease is now down to around 40%. Fortunately severe illness is still protected against at about 90% but remember originally the protection was at 98-99% against severe illness.

Second, The disease is absolutely ripping through the unvaccinated. Hospitalization rates in those between the ages of 20-60 who are unvaccinated is significantly higher than previously. As an example hospitalizations in Las Vegas are now higher than they were at the peak of last summers

surge. This is striking considering the average age of hospitalization is much, much younger than previously and around 50% of the population has been taken out of the equation through vaccination.

So as always if you or your loved one isn't vaccinated PLEASE GET VACCINATED and if you live in an area of high transmission. Mask up. Take care and stay safe. John

I would also like to provide some mitigation measures that could be considered based on the grant funding mentioned in this agenda item totaling \$2,395,923.18. (Agenda item 2.15 for Title 1 School Improvement). Unfortunately, this link was not available via DOE NV and I requested a response but have not received access to view this information. Please provide that data per the request in this email so as to provide transparency.

Suggestions based on successful measures within other education facilities in the US:

- Facility modifications, such as the installation of [Germicidal Ultraviolet Lights](#) inside HVAC systems located in all classrooms, bathrooms and elevators, to destroy harmful microorganisms, including mold, mildew, fungi, bacteria, and viruses like COVID-19, eliminate bad odors, and purify the air; as well as the installation of electrostatic air purifiers in common areas to remove contaminants from the air and improve air quality; and re-equipment of all HVAC systems with advanced filters to mechanically purify the air.
- Enhanced cleaning training and routines: All faculty, staff, and students will have training on hygiene requirements and cleaning practices, and cleaning crews will be doing hourly sanitization of surfaces and nightly deep cleaning and sanitizing.
- Temperature screenings: The school asks that all parents screen their child's temperature before coming to school, and will do temperature checks upon arrival for all visitors with thermal cameras and no-touch sensors.
- Stay home requirements: The school's sick policy has been updated to include a required stay-home clause for any individual who is feeling unwell, with at least 48 hours of being symptom-free before returning to school (this includes students, visitors, faculty and staff).

I would like to know what we can do to support this. I request a response from those included on this email as to the safety data related to depleting oxygen from our children as it has already been illustrated **NOT** to be safe. (attached) Carbon Monoxide Factsheet per OSHA.


A key factor in supporting academic success is working to ensure that every student feels safe at school. I know that I am not alone in feeling anxious and vulnerable when people around me are not wearing masks. This anxiety is detrimental to my ability to concentrate and could easily reduce my chances of academic success as I might not be able to focus on the content presented to me in school.

Requiring face coverings will also promote and model the idea of personal and civic responsibility since wearing masks will not only protect the individual but our peers as well. There are some students who are not able to get vaccinated (due to age, allergies, health conditions, etc.), meaning that they are especially vulnerable to COVID-19. This is why it is important that we practice civic responsibility by wearing masks to protect ourselves, as well as those who are most vulnerable.

While I and many of my peers are grateful that we will be going back to school fully in person this year, many of us are concerned about the absence of face coverings now that there will be up to 35 of us crammed into a classroom shoulder to shoulder. Even with reduced capacity last school year, staying 6 feet apart was very difficult, so this year social distancing seems virtually impossible, meaning that masks are necessary to keep each student and family safe. The presence of face coverings does not compromise a student's ability to learn, but the constant fear and anxiety that results from a lack of masks could inhibit many students' ability to learn. Additionally, contracting COVID-19 would undoubtedly inhibit academic success since the isolation period and recovery would keep students out of school for at least two weeks.

Although wearing a mask does reduce an individual's chance of contracting COVID-19, what offers the most protection aside from isolation and social distancing is when every student wears a mask. It is not enough for some students to choose to wear a mask; it takes effort from every community member and student to keep everyone safe.

As you can see in the infographic below, if a carrier is unmasked, others are far more likely to be infected than if the carrier is wearing a mask. It is likely that those who choose to wear masks are more careful than those who don't. As a result of this general behavior, students who do not wear masks could be more likely to have COVID-19 and are therefore more likely to spread it to other students even if the uninfected person wears a mask. In other words, those who will choose not to wear a mask are arguably the ones that need to wear face coverings the most to protect those around them.



It is in the best interest of all students, faculty, and families to require masks this upcoming school year. I want to leave you with a few facts supported by science and health organizations showing the need for masks for the upcoming school year.

There is **ample evidence supporting the face coverings**. I see no reason why masks should not be required since there is **no peer-reviewed literature saying that masks are to the detriment of our community**. Many students, staff, and families **feel unsafe without a mask requirement**, especially since social distancing will not be possible this year. Wearing masks proposes no real danger that could interfere with student success. It is a minor inconvenience, if at all, that will **save lives and the mental health of our students**. It is essential for everyone to wear masks in order to protect ourselves and others.

None of us chose to live through a pandemic, but we as a community can choose to hold each other accountable and require masks.



I am sending you this notice, on behalf of my two children, Sophie and Delsie Duvall, who attend high school in the Washoe County School District. My findings raise significant concerns, both medically and legally, of the current mask policy in place – Governor’s Directive 045. Masks are ineffective for the purpose claimed by the mandate, potentially harmful, and only authorized for use by an EUA.

Masks are ineffective and in many ways they harm.

It’s a myth that masks prevent viruses from spreading. The overall evidence is clear: Standard cloth and surgical masks offer next to no protection against virus-sized particles or small aerosols.¹ The size of a virus particle is much too small to be stopped by a surgical mask, cloth or bandana. A single virion of SARS-CoV-2 is about 60-140 nanometers or 0.1 microns.² The pore size in a surgical mask is 200-1000x that size.

Consider that the CDC website states, “surgical masks do not catch all harmful particles in smoke.” And that the size of smoke particles in a wildfire are ~0.5 microns which is 5x the size of the SARS-CoV-2 virus! Wearing a mask to prevent catching SARS-CoV-2, or similarly sized influenza, is like throwing sand at a chain-link fence: it doesn’t work. There has been one large randomized controlled trial that specifically examined whether masks protect their wearers from the coronavirus. This study found mask wearing “did not reduce, at conventional levels of statistical significance, the incidence of Sars-Cov-2-infection.”³

Consider also, that the existence of more particles does not mean more virus. Research shows less virus does not mean less illness. Dr. Kevin Fennelly, a pulmonologist at the National Heart, Lung and Blood institute debunked the view that larger droplets are responsible for viral transmission. Fennelly wrote:

“current infection control policies are based on the premise that most respiratory infections are transmitted by large respiratory droplets- i.e., larger than 5 [microns] – produced by coughing and sneezing, ...Unfortunately, that premise is wrong.”⁴

Fennelly referenced a 1953 paper on anthrax that showed a single bacterial spore of about one micron was significantly more lethal than larger clumps of spores.⁵ Exposure to one virus particle is theoretically enough to cause infection and subsequent disease. This is not an alarming thought - it simply means what it has always meant, that our immune system protects us continually all our life.⁶

There have been hundreds of mask studies related to influenza transmission done over several decades. It is a well-established fact that masks do not stop viruses. "Part of that evidence shows that cloth facemasks actually increase influenza-linked illness."⁷ Bacteria are 50x larger than virus particles.⁸ As such, virus particles can enter through the mask pores, yet bacteria remain trapped inside of the mask, resulting in the mask-wearer continually exposed to the bacteria.

Related to the 1918-1919 influenza pandemic, there was almost universal agreement among experts, that deaths were virtually never caused by the influenza virus itself but resulted directly from severe secondary pneumonia caused by well-known bacterial "pneumopathogens" that colonized the upper respiratory tract.⁹ Dr. Fauci and his National Institute of Health studied pandemics and epidemics and concluded, "the vast majority of influenza deaths resulted from secondary bacterial pneumonia."¹⁰

All parties mandating the use of facemasks are not only willfully ignoring established science but are engaging in what amounts to a whole state clinical experimental trial. This conclusion is reached by the fact that facemask use and COVID-19 incidence are being reported in scientific opinion pieces promoted by the CDC and others.¹¹ The fact is after reviewing ALL of the studies worldwide, the CDC found "no reduction in viral transmission with the use of face masks."¹²

Additionally, children have been repeatedly shown not to be drivers of this contagion. It is well accepted that children have a statistically zero chance of dying from COVID. The CDC shows the K-12 mortality rate from or with COVID is .00003.¹³ Any intervention, especially one that is prophylactic, must cause fewer harms to the recipient than the infection. Since children have the lowest death rate from COVID infection, the cost-benefit of requiring children to wear an investigational face-covering with emerging safety issues is especially difficult to justify. Anthony Fauci was very clear that asymptomatic transmission was not a threat. He stated, "in all the history of respiratory-borne viruses of any type, asymptomatic transmission has never been the driver of outbreaks. The driver of outbreaks is always a symptomatic person."¹⁴

Wearing respirators comes with a host of physiological and psychological burdens. These can interfere with task performances and reduce work efficiency. These burdens can even be severe enough to cause life-threatening conditions if not ameliorated.¹⁵ Fifteen years ago, National Taiwan University Hospital concluded that the use of N-95 masks in healthcare workers caused them to experience hypoxemia, a low level of oxygen in the blood, and hypercapnia, an elevation in the blood's carbon dioxide levels.¹⁶ Studies of simple surgical masks found significant reductions in blood oxygen as well. In one particular study, researchers

measured blood oxygenation before and after surgeries in 53 surgeons. Researchers found the mask reduced the blood oxygen levels significantly, and the longer the duration of wearing the mask, the greater the drop in blood oxygen levels.¹⁷

Moreover, people with cancer, will be at a further risk from hypoxia, as cancer cells grow best in a bodily environment that is low in oxygen. Low oxygen also promotes systemic inflammation which, in turn, promotes “the growth, invasion and spread of cancers.”¹⁸ Repeated episodes of low oxygen, known as intermittent hypoxia, also “causes atherosclerosis” and hence increases “all cardiovascular events” such as heart attacks, as well as adverse cerebral events like stroke.¹⁹

Furthermore, the mandatory mouth mask in schools is a major threat to a child’s development. It ignores the essential needs of a growing child. The well-being of children and young people is highly dependent on the emotional connection with others. Masks create a threatening and unsafe environment, where emotional connection becomes difficult.²⁰

Informed consent is required for investigational medical therapies.

Regardless of the lack of safety and efficacy behind the decision to require a child to wear a mask, it is illegal to mandate EUA approved investigational medical therapies without informed consent. Mask use for viral transmission prevention is authorized for Emergency Use only.²¹ Emergency Use Authorization by the FDA, means “the products are investigational and experimental” only.²² The statute granting the FDA the power to authorize a medical product of emergency use requires that the person being administered the unapproved product be advised of his or her right to refuse administration of the product.²³ This statute further recognizes the well-settled doctrine that medical experiments, or “clinical research,” may not be performed on human subjects without the express, informed consent of the individual receiving treatment.²⁴

The right to avoid the imposition of human experimentation is fundamental, rooted in the Nuremberg Code of 1947, has been ratified by the 1964 Declaration of Helsinki, and further codified in the United States Code of Federal Regulations. In addition to the United States regarding itself as bound by these provisions, these principles were adopted by the FDA in its regulations requiring the informed consent of human subjects for medical research.²⁵ The law is very clear; It is unlawful to conduct medical research (even in the case of emergency), unless steps taken to ... secure informed consent of all participants.²⁶

Furthermore, by requiring children to wear a mask, you are promoting the idea that the mask can prevent or treat a disease, which is an illegal deceptive practice. It is unlawful to advertise that a product or service can prevent...disease unless you possess competent and reliable scientific evidence... substantiating that the claims are true.²⁷

The FDA EUA for surgical and/or cloth masks explicitly states, “the labeling must not state or imply... that the [mask] is intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection or related, or for use such as infection prevention or reduction.”²⁸

Illegally mandating an investigational medical therapy generates liability.

There are no efficacy standards on child-sized masks and respirators under OSHA, but there are proven microbial challenges as well as breathing difficulties that are created and exacerbated by masking children.


Requiring children to wear a mask sets the stage for contracting any infection, including COVID-19, and making the consequences of that infection much graver. In essence, a mask may very well put children at an increased risk of infection, and if so, having a far worse outcome.²⁹

The fact that mask wearing presents a severe risk of harm to the wearer should – standing alone – not be required for children, particularly given that these children are not ill and have done nothing wrong that would warrant an infringement of their constitutional rights and bodily autonomy. Promoting use of a non-FDA approved, Emergency Use Authorized mask, is unwarranted and illegal. This mandate is in direct conflict with Section 360bbb-3€(1)(A)(ii)(I-III), which requires the wearer to be informed of the option to refuse the wearing of such “device.” Misrepresenting the use of a mask as being intended for antimicrobial or antiviral protection, and/or misrepresenting masks for use as infection prevention or reduction is a deceptive practice under the FTC. It is clear, there is no waiver of liability under deceptive practices, even under a state of emergency. As such, forcing children to wear masks, or similarly forcing use any other non-FDA approved medical product without the child’s (or the child’s parental) consent, is illegal and immoral.

This letter serves as official notice that Sophie and Delsie Duvall do not consent to being forced to wear a mask. Sophie’s and Delsie’s advocates will not fail to take the maximum action permissible under the law against your organization, and against you personally. Accordingly, I urge you to comply with Federal and State law, and advise children they have a right to refuse

to wear a mask as a measure to prevent or reduce infection from COVID-19. Any other course of action is contrary to the law. I am willing to testify as to the veracity of the contents in this document. Please confirm no further pressure will be exerted upon Sophie or Delsie to follow this illegal mask mandate, and that Sophie and Delsie Duvall not face any retaliatory disciplinary action.
