### **Dual Credit**



- → TMCC's Dual Credit Program allow high school students to earn college credit and high school credit at the same time.
  o 9-12 grade
- → High school students have the opportunity to take college credit classes taught either by a TMCC Faculty member or qualified instructor at their high school.
- → Dual credit students can graduate earlier from college as they are accumulating many of the needed credits during high school.

#### **High School**


- → Each school district, or in some cases high school, determine what type and how many credits students receive for each college class.
  - We highly encourage students to work with their high school counselors to learn how their credits will be applied to their high school transcript.
- → WCSD has a comprehensive list of how credits are accepted.

#### **Colleges/Universities**

- → Most TMCC classes will transfer to other colleges within the Nevada System of Higher Education (NSHE).
- → Students must check with the other colleges/universities Admissions office to make sure their classes will transfer without issues.









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#### **Concurrent Enrollment**



- → Classes are taught in person or online by a qualified high school instructor.
- → Enrollment is restricted to a selected group of students who may earn dual credit.
- $\rightarrow$  Classes are selected based on the high school needs/students interest.
  - To determine if these classes are being offered at your high school, please reach out to your high school counselor.
- → \$75 per class (no other fees)



#### **Cohort Classes**



- → Classes are taught in different modes (in-person, online, web-live, hybrid) by a TMCC faculty member.
- → Enrollment is restricted to a selected group of students who may earn dual credit.
- → Classes are selected based on the high school needs/students interest.
  - To determine if these classes are being offered at your high school, please reach out to your high school counselor.
- → \$ 85 per credit (plus per credit tech fee and any special fee associated w/class)



#### J2TMCC - Jump Start to TMCC



- → Classes are taken with the general TMCC population.
- → Students can take the classes in various formats such as in-person, online, web-live, or hybrid.
- → Students take classes for dual credit/personal interest/advancement.
- → \$ 85 per credit (plus per credit tech fee and any special fee associated w/class)

#### **Registration and Mandatory Fees**



- → \$75 per class is only for concurrent enrollment
- → All other classes are \$85 per credit (plus per credit tech fee and any special fee associated w/class)
- → Students are responsible for class materials/textbook

#### Benefits

#### **Student Responsibilities**



- → Students are responsible for all registration fees and other mandatory fees.
- → Understand how TMCC classes are used to complete high school requirements.
- → College classes require more work and greater level of independence compared to high school classes
- → Failing classes will have future consequences to GPA, Financial Aid, etc.



### Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act - FERPA



- → Truckee Meadows Community College is required by federal law, regardless of age, to keep student record confidential.
- → Without the student's express permission, TMCC cannot share student records with anyone but the student (or appropriate College employees, high school employees, or Dual Credit instructors).
- → Jump Start staff will help students and parents navigate the enrollment process.
- → Students are the only point of contact with college professors.

- Are you mature and disciplined to start college?
- Can you manage the load of a college level class?
- Are you independent?
- Do you manage your time well?
- Can you handle a flexible schedule and heavy workload?

#### How to Succeed



- → Ask for help!
  - Do not wait last minute
  - Speak with your professor/high school counselor
- → Communication
  - Check your TMCC Student email on a daily basis
  - Take advantage of office hours with professors
- → Syllabus
  - Review for dates and deadlines
  - Plan ahead
- → College grades
  - Permanent on your college transcript
  - Do not get discouraged

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#### **1.** Apply for Admission

- → Apply: apply.tmcc.edu
- → Make sure to select appropriate term (Fall, Spring or Summer)
- → Recommend selecting email to receive Admissions Letter.
  - TMCC Username
  - TMCC Password
  - TMCC Student ID (NSHE)
  - TMCC Email



#### **2.** Complete Jump Start Orientation

- → Provides guidance and helpful resources to be successful.
- → Log in to Canvas with your username and Password found in your Admissions Letter.

#### **3.** Complete Permission to Enroll Form





- → Students will need to complete the online <u>Permission to Enroll form</u>. The form will be automatically sent to the high school counselor for approval.
- → Most Jump Start students have an under 18 Hold and cannot enroll themselves.
- → Online form is now available on our website

#### **Fall Semester**

- Enrollment starts in April.
- Students don't pay until August!

### **Spring Semester**

- Enrollment starts in November.
- Students don't pay until January!



#### **Test Scores**

## **ATMCC**



- → Some TMCC classes require students to submit test scores for classes who have prerequisites.
- → Jump Start accepts: ACT, SAT, AP, high school transcripts (if applicable), and other college transcripts.
- → Need test scores? schedule to take the ACCUPLACER online: testing.tmcc.edu
  - Accuplacer is only for placement in English and Math.
  - Highest course placement for Math: Math 126
  - Highest course placement for English: ENG 101





- → Schedule for Summer and Fall 2023 is now available at schedule.tmcc.edu!
- → Summer 2023 Registration Dates
  - April 3 priority registration begins for continuing students
  - April 10 registration begins for continuing students with over 60 credits
  - April 11 registration begins for continuing students with over 30 credits
  - April 12- registration begins for continuing students with less than 30 credits
  - April 13 registration opens for new students



#### **Important Dates**



#### → Fall 2023 Registration Dates

- April 10 priority registration begins for continuing students
- April 17 registration begins for continuing students with over 60 credits
- April 18 registration begins for continuing students with over 30 credits
- April 19- registration begins for continuing students with less than 30 credits
- April 20 registration opens for new students

- → Online Permission to Enroll form is now available on our website!
  - Returning students must fill out a new form every semester.
- → Summer 2023 Session I begins on May 30 (Also last day to add a Summer session I class)
- → Summer 2023 Session II begins on July 10 (Also last day to add a Summer session II class)
- → Fall 2023 Semester begins on Aug 21
  Last day to add a regular Fall semester class is Friday, August 25
