<b>Tienes</b> ( <i>tee-'eh-nehs</i> )	=	You (informal) have
<b>Tiene</b> ( <i>tee-'eh-neh</i> )	=	You (formal) have, He has, She has
<b>Tenemos</b> ( <i>teh-'neh-mohs</i> )	=	We have
<b>Tienen</b> ( <i>tee-'eh-nehn</i> )	=	You have (pl.), They have

<b>las papas fritas</b> ( <i>lahs ‘pah-pahs ‘free-tahs</i> )	=	french fries
<b>el arroz</b> ( <i>ehl ah-‘rrohs</i> )	=	rice
<b>los frijoles</b> ( <i>lohs free-‘hoh-lehs</i> )	=	beans
<b>la lechuga</b> ( <i>lah leh-‘choo-gah</i> )	=	lettuce
<b>la cebolla</b> ( <i>lah seh-‘boh-yah</i> )	=	onions
<b>el tomate</b> ( <i>ehl toh-‘mah-teh</i> )	=	tomato

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<b>el café</b> ( <i>ehl kah-‘feh</i> )	=	coffee
<b>el café descafeinado</b> ( <i>ehl kah-‘feh dehs-kah-feh ‘ee-‘nah-doh</i> )	=	decaffeinated coffee
<b>la soda deitética</b> ( <i>lah ‘soh-dah dee-eh-‘teh-tee-kah</i> )	=	diet soda
<b>el refresco</b> ( <i>ehl reh-‘frehs-koh</i> )	=	soft drink
<b>el té helado</b> ( <i>ehl teh eh-‘lah-doh</i> )	=	iced tea
<b>el jugo</b> ( <i>ehl ‘hoo-goh</i> )	=	juice
<b>la limonada</b> ( <i>lah lee-moh-‘nah-dah</i> )	=	lemonade
<b>la leche</b> ( <i>lah ‘leh-cheh</i> )	=	milk
<b>el batido</b> ( <i>ehl bah-‘tee-doh</i> )	=	milkshake
<b>el agua</b> ( <i>ehl ‘ah-gwah</i> )	=	water
