LeBron James earned 24 million dollars during the 2014-15 NBA season. He earned an additional 42 million through his endorsements from companies like Coca Cola, Nike and Samsung.	
LeBron James' strength and agility creates the illusion that he defies gravity. However, by understanding Newton's Third Law of Motion, fans would understand that it is the strength of his legs core and torso that contribute to the energy that he forces onto the court. <b>Rule</b>	
Michael Jordan, a famous basketball player in the 1980s and 90s, also had one of the highest vertical leaps in NBA history. <b>Rule</b>	
Fannie Lou Hamer is a heroine of the Civil Rights Movement. <b>Rule</b>	
Responding to the challenges Hamer faced in Mississippi, she said, "I guess if I'd had any sense, I'd have been a little scared—but what was the point of being scared? The only thing they could do was kill me, and it kind seemed like they'd been trying to do that a little bit at time since I could remember. <b>Rule</b>	
The Civil Rights Movement improved the lives of African Americans by insuring equal access to housing, jobs, education and securing the right to vote. <b>Rule</b>
