

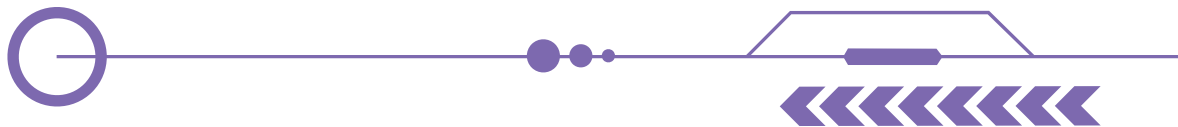

Adopt a deepened knowledge of neurological development and applied behavior analysis to help students with ASD develop life skills for transitioning to independent learning. Learn to assess and enhance these social, cognitive and behavioral skills with an innovative approach.

Communication with an Emphasis in Education*

Turn a passion for communications into a teaching career at a postsecondary institution. You will develop expertise in understanding, demonstrating and teaching all aspects of communication, including its impact on culture, society, media, strategy and relationships.

Curriculum and Instruction

Grow into an instructional leader by learning to develop and implement engaging, culturally responsive curriculum. You will acquire skills for academic planning and instructional strategy development based on theories and research-based data with a scholar-practitioner approach.

English with an Emphasis in Education*

Gain advanced training in English and research-based pedagogy to teach at campus and online higher learning institutions. This program focuses on teaching writing and literature, the practice of professional writing, communication and theories of writing and rhetoric.

History with an Emphasis in Education*

Pursue a curiosity for history and identify pedagogical practices for a career in higher education. Areas of study include historical events, themes, narratives, arguments and interpretations. You will evaluate cultural, political, economic and military histories from across the globe.

Reading with an Emphasis in Elementary Education

Reading with an Emphasis in Secondary Education
