Student Success Goal

By the next State English Language Arts Exam, Dodson will improve ELA Proficiency for all students by 13 percentage points to get to the 39-percentile proficient. By the next State Math Exam, Dodson will improve Math Proficiency for all students by 19 percentage points to get to the 30-percentile proficient.

To support students to achieve this goal, we will provide:

1. Staff training for i-Ready.
2. Effective implementation of i-Ready.
3. Guided Language Acquisition Design (GLAD) Trainer to offer GLAD Refresher Training to staff.
4. Two 60 min. Planning/Professional Learning Community days per week.
5. Learning Facilitator to Coach/Co Teach in classrooms targeted for specific classroom needs.

Student, Staff, and Family Partnerships Goal

During the 2023-2024 school year, we will increase parent attendance at PNT meetings by 50% as measured by attendance logs. During the 2023-2024 school year, we will increase the participation for School Climate Survey for Families by 10% as measured by the amount of returned surveys.

To support students and families to achieve this goal, we will:

1. Retain a full-time FACE (Family and Community Engagement) liaison.
2. Teachers personally invite at least one family to attend PNT meetings and paper flyers handed out to families with day, time, and agenda.
3. Monthly PNT meetings have a specific focus that is communicated to families ahead of time on the school calendar and Dojo.
4. Parent Teacher Home Visit Program.
5. Counselor will read the Climate Survey to Students.





Percent Achieving 'At or Above' Standard


