

Student Success Goal

Students will improve their math levels as measured by i-Ready diagnostic by decreasing the lowest quintile by 2 percent.

Students will improve their reading scores as measured by i-Ready diagnostic by reducing the percentage of students in the 4th and 5th quintile by 2%.

To support students to achieve this goal, we will:

1. At the beginning of the first quarter, Swope will implement additional math instruction during Advisory for the remainder of 2023-24 SY using i-Ready.
2. Swope will implement i-Ready as English Language Arts (ELA) intervention in the classroom as well as continue a reading program for students at or above grade-level.
3. Development of Tier 1 instruction with a focus on new curriculum in science, social studies, and ELA.

Student, Staff, and Family Partnerships Goal

By the end of each quarter of the 2023-2024 School Year, Swope Middle School will reduce the combination of chronic absenteeism and severely chronic absenteeism to less than 10 Percent.

To support students and families to achieve this goal, we will:

1. Identify students with two or more risk factors on the District Early Warning System and utilize it to create cohort to improve communication with families as it relates to attendance and behavior risk factors.
2. Provide training for Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) usage in the classroom, set up calendar for usage, support purchase of rewards for student and staff usage.
3. Provide access to Second Step and Restorative Circles to include use of Restorative Circles in Staff Training.





Percent Achieving 'At or Above' Standard


