Who can enroll in this program?

- Any 8th grader in WCSD can apply for Sparks High's Tech Science & Manufacturing Academy, but 75% of its seats are reserved for students living in the Sparks High School attendance zone.
- Applications to enroll are available starting November 15th and you can request a paper copy from your counselor, or complete one online at www.washoeschools.net/signatureacademies.

Are there requirements to apply?

- There are basic qualifications to be eligible for enrollment, but all interested students are encouraged to apply! For specific information on qualifications and how to

Does Sparks High offer any other programs that allow students to explore and prepare for careers and life after high school?

- Yes! Sparks High offers several other "Career Technical Education" (CTE) programs in:
 - Computer Science
 - Foods & Nutrition
 - Military Science
 - Multimedia Communications
- Students can enter a full 3-year program or just take one of these courses to explore! All CTE courses fulfill WCSD graduation requirements for elective credit, and students

who complete a full CTE program are eligible for college credit!
