Single-Point Entry Pilot Project

In an effort to increase the safety in our schools, the Safe & Healthy Schools Commission is working with our Washoe County School District Capitol Projects team in constructing single-point entries at three of our area high schools. Damonte Ranch has been included under this pilot program to increase the safety of our campus for the 2024-2025 School Year. The Capitol Projects team will begin the new remodel construction this summer. The construction will focus on remodeling the front entrance to our campus, in which guests will have to check in via an intercom system before being able to enter our building during the school day. There will also be perimeter fencing installed with safety push gates at the back of the school to eliminate unnecessary traffic behind the school and directing all visitors to enter from the main entrance for proper check in. We will provide more details and guidance when we approach the start of the next school year regarding our single-point entry procedures.

Dress Code

A) The dress or grooming of students must not present potential health or safety problems. Clothing should fit so that it does not create a health or safety issue. B) Clothing shall not contain unprotected speech including, but not limited to: obscene, vulgar, or profane language or illustrations; and, nothing that promotes an illegal activity, including underage drinking, illegal drug use (to include marijuana), domestic abuse, gang membership, battery, assault, or any other civil or criminal conduct which would violate state or federal law. C) Clothing must cover the body from the chest/breasts to below the buttocks. This includes all private/intimate parts of the body, including the midriff. i. Shirts that expose the shoulders, tank tops. and thin or "spaghetti" straps that adhere to the other provisions of this dress code are allowed. ii. Undergarments shall not be intentionally exposed (e.g., bras, boxer shorts). iii. Shorts, skirts, skorts, and dresses must be an appropriate length, extending to the student's mid-thigh. iv. Pants/bottoms with rips, tears, or mesh are acceptable, but shall not reveal or expose a private/intimate part of the body nor cause a safety concern (e.g., a tripping hazard because the hem of the pant leg drags on the floor). v. Nylons/panty hose/tights may be worn as an undergarment under clothing, but not alone as pants/bottoms. **D)** Allowable head coverings are determined by the classroom teacher and will be noted in each teacher's syllabus. Hoods are not to be worn anywhere inside the building. E) Sunglasses may not be worn inside the building during school hours, except for medical reasons. F) Proper footwear must be worn at all times and shall not pose a potential health or safety problem. G) In accordance with state law, items that have been identified as gang-related are prohibited. WCSD School Police, in conjunction with local law enforcement and other agencies, shall determine current prohibitions related to gang appearance, dress, accessories, and activities and shall inform school administrators as needed.

We are entering the last quarter of the 2023-2024 School Year. Please continue to monitor your child's attendance and grades on Infinite Campus so they can finish strong. If you are unable to access the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, please contact drhstech@washoeschools.net and they can reset your Infinite Campus password. Remember both absences and tardies impact your child's ability to be successful in their classes.

Damonte Ranch has implemented a New Tardy Policy this semester to help motivate students to arrive to class on time ready to learn. Some of the more severe consequences include in-school and out-of-school suspension. Tardies will reset after Spring Break. See the new Per Period Tardy Policy below. <u>Per period tardies</u> will be pulled weekly by the Corral. Students having more than 4 tardies in a single period during a quarter will earn the following consequences:

- Round 1 4/5 tardies in a single period during a quarter grading period: 20-minute lunch detention.
- Round 2 6/7 tardies in a single period during a quarter grading period: VIP lunch detention.
- Round 3 8/9 tardies in a single period during a quarter grading period: In-House Suspension.
- Round 4 10+ tardies: Parent conference/one day Out-of-School Suspension.

As we round the corner into the last quarter of the 2023-2024 School Year, we want to take a moment to send out a couple of year-end reminders.

Class of 2025 - You will need the second dose of your Meningococcal (MCV4) vaccine before starting your senior year. You can get this vaccine anytime after your 16th birthday. Avoid the stress and rush of last-minute vaccine appointments and get it early, once you've turned 16.

Immunization Exemptions (Religious or Medical) - For any students with a current exemption on file, we want to remind you that these require new paperwork each year, if you continue to need the exemption. Toward the end of this school year we will send home new exemption forms. If you need to continue your student's exemption, please fill it out and submit it back to us as soon as you can to avoid the last minute rush in August.

Illness - When to Keep Your Student Home - Please continue to keep your student home if they experience a fever of 100.4 or greater, any vomiting or diarrhea. They can return when they have been symptom free for 24 hours without the use of symptom-reducing medication.

- If they have a sore throat, please keep them home until it improves.
- If your student **tests positive for COVID 19**, please keep them home isolating away from others for 5 days from when symptoms started. If they are feeling better they can return to school wearing a mask from day 6-10.

Please remember to call the school attendance line to report your student's absence, so their attendance can be appropriately marked.

The Math Department is looking for Math Peer Tutors for every period next year, including during IC. If your student got a B or higher in their Math class this year and would like to be a Math Peer Tutor, please contact Mrs. Ault in Room 122 or at aault@washoeschools.net.

Damonte is offering 6 Dual-Credit Math classes next year through WNC for students who have successfully completed Algebra 2 and have met the grade prerequisites. Three courses are one-semester long: Math 124 (College Algebra), Stats 152 (Intro to Statistics), and Math 182 (Calculus II). Other courses run for a full year: Math 126 (Pre-Calculus), Math 126/127 (Pre-Calculus with Trig), and Math 181 (Calculus I). Each course is taught by a Damonte Math Teacher, and WNC has allowed us to maintain our rigor from when these courses were honors or AP courses. We strongly encourage eligible students to consider these options, as Dual-Credit courses save families thousands of dollars in college tuition. Interested students should talk to their Math teachers for more information.
