Students who enroll in AP Spanish should already have knowledge of the language and culture of Spanish speaking people and should have attained an appropriate proficiency in listening comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing. This level stresses oral skills, composition, and grammar. Such a course emphasizes the use of Spanish for active communication. All students who enroll in AP Spanish must take the AP exam in May.

This class is an advanced class that covers the major movements in Hispanic and Peninsular literature from the medieval period to the 20_{th} century. Students will read all of the required readings from the AP Spanish Literature list which represent works from four major genres: narrative, poetry, essay and theater. Students will actively engage with text, understand the background in which it was written, think critically about its themes and message, and analyze the author's purpose. They will also write interpretive and analytical compositions and work to develop their academic writing skills in Spanish. This class will be conducted exclusively in Spanish. All students who enroll in AP Spanish must take the AP exam in May.

The Advanced Placement French Language and Culture course is designed to prepare French students for the AP French Language and Culture exam. The goal of AP French is to develop students' communicative ability in the three modes of communication (Interpersonal, Interpretive and Presentational) through the use of authentic materials. This course will develop students' listening comprehension and reading skills using different kinds of authentic texts and aural materials. AP French will hone students' ability to express themselves in both written and oral French at the level of intermediate to pre-advanced range. These skills will be practiced through the study of cultural aspects of the French and francophone world in six major categories set by the College Board. Students are required to take the AP exam in May. All AP exams have a cost associated with them.
