Cell Phone & Personal Electronic Device Expectations



Thank you for reinforcing this school policy by partnering with us. By working together, we can help our students be successful.

- A no cell phone or personal electronic device rule during instructional time will be followed. Students will be asked to keep their cell phones and personal electronic devices out of sight or in their backpacks during instructional time.
- This expectation will support the highest quality education for our students.
- Cell phone usage negatively impacts students' mental health and motivation to learn and focus.
- Students deserve an education that prepares them for a career or college or whatever path they choose.
- Students can achieve high expectations and a partnership with staff and families to meet these expectations is valued.

During instructional time, students are not permitted to use or display the following personal electronic devices:	During instructional time, students are not permitted to use or display the following personal electronic devices, except when explicitly directed by staff to use such devices for instructional purposes:

Outside instructional time, reasonable and responsible use of electronic devices in common areas (outside of classrooms) is not explicitly prohibited, provided that such use does not interfere with the learning environment and learning activities at Hug.

Under exceptional documented circumstances and approved by administration, exceptions to the above restrictions may be made.

Cell Phone & Personal Electronic Device Expectations

Consequences for violating principles of electronic device expectations:

- 1) First Offense: Student receives a verbal warning and the teacher/staff reteaches expectations.
- 2) Second Offense: Electronic device is confiscated by teacher/staff and returned to the student at the end of the period.
 - a) Teacher/Staff reteaches expectations.
 - b) Teacher inputs minor behavior with resolution and makes contact with family via phone call, email, google voice, etc.
- 3) Third Offense: Electronic device is confiscated by teacher/staff and turned in to the Dean's office.
 - a) Teacher/Staff reteaches expectations.
 - b) Teacher makes contact with Dean's via email/phone and electronic device is picked up and turned in to the main office.
 - c) Teacher inputs minor behavior with resolution and makes contact with family via phone call, email, google voice, etc.
 - d) Student may pick up phone in main office at the end of the day.
- 4) Fourth Offense: Electronic device is confiscated by teacher/staff and turned in to the Dean's office.
 - a. Teacher/Staff reteaches expectations.
 - b. Teacher makes contact with Dean's via email/phone and electronic device is picked up and turned in to the main office.
 - c. Teacher inputs minor behavior with resolution and makes contact with family via phone call, email, google voice, etc.
 - d. Parent/Guardian, or approved pick up person per Parent/Guardian, must pick up electronic device in main office. The electronic device will not be given to the student.
- 5) Fifth and Subsequent Offense: Electronic device is confiscated by teacher/staff and turned in to the Dean's office.
 - a) Teacher/Staff reteaches expectations.
 - b) Teacher makes contact with Dean's via email/phone and electronic device is picked up and turned in to the main office.
 - c) Dean inputs major behavior and makes contact with family via phone call, email, google voice, etc. Further discipline will be issued based on the WCSD behavior matrix.
 - d) Parent/Guardian, or approved pick up person per Parent/Guardian, must pick up electronic device in main office. The electronic device will not be given to the student.

****If at any time in this process a student refuses to relinquish their electronic device, follow instructions, or becomes defiant, student will immediately be referred to the deans for further appropriate consequences.**

Athletic Participation
Requirement Checklist
2022 – 2023

In order for a student to participate in any athletic event, team, or sport, the following items MUST be completed/paid, prior to any/all participation.



Athletic Packet Completion and Register My Athlete (RMA) Account Creation/Update

- Students and Parents must have a complete and updated Register My Athlete account *prior to tryout and participation in each sport*, during the school year (www.registermyathlete.com). Additional documents and/or forms may be needed per WUSD and/or NIAA and will be detailed within the Register My Athlete registration process as applicable.
- Registration is required each year for students to participate in Athletics. The athletic registration must be FULLY completed by student and parent through their Register My Athlete portal and verified as cleared, prior to participation in any sport related activities throughout the school year.
- Pre-Participation Physical Exam required the athlete's first and third year of participation and must be completed by an authorized medical practitioner. A health questionnaire update form should be completed the athlete's second and fourth year of participation.

Student Activity Fee \$25

- (Athletes) Required each year for students to participate in Athletics and **must be paid prior to first scrimmage/game.**



Athletic Transportation Fee \$50

- Required for students to participate in sports and **must be paid prior to tryout.**



Athletic Training Fee \$10

- Required for students to participate in sports and **must be paid prior to first scrimmage/game.**



Athletic Impact (concussion) Assessment Fee \$5

- Required for students to participate in sports **and must be paid prior to tryout.**



Athletic Equipment Fee \$10

- Required for students to participate in sports and **must be paid prior to first scrimmage/game.**

Additional fees will be assessed based on specific sport participation and requirements. These costs will be provided to athletes and parents directly by the sport specific coach, and/or athletic director, prior to the start of the sport's specific competition season (Fall, Winter, or Spring). Student athletes responsible for lost or destroyed uniform(s) or equipment will receive fines for the items lost/damaged.

Hug Athletic Registration Procedures



Washoe County School District and Hug High School utilizes **Register My Athlete** (RMA) to register athletes for NIAA sanctioned sports. A parent/guardian must have their own account and will need to add each student-athlete under that account. After the initial account set-up, the sport(s) will need to be updated each season of participation, for each student-athlete, moving forward. Below are the instructions for creating an account and completing the RMA registration process.

Go to <http://registermyathlete.com>. There is also a link on the Hug High School website, Athletics page

1. Create an Account *(If you already have an account, after logging in, go directly to step 4)*
 - Select “Create an Account”
 - Complete required information. The system will automatically log you in and you will be required to accept the terms of use.
 - Click on Start/Complete Registrations, then click on Start New Registration.
 - In the search window that appears, type Hug and then click on the school logo/name to select it.
2. Add a New Athlete
 - Click on – “Select Athlete” and then “Add New Athlete”

This needs to be done only once during each athlete’s entire career at our school.
3. Complete Athlete’s Profile

This page is a summary of their information and previous involvement in athletics.
4. Register for Sport – Tryout Checklist
 - Select Register for a Sport
 - Choose a Sport
5. Your Registration Checklist and Documents
 - ****NOTE:** Under “Nevada Questionnaire” section, only answer Yes IF athlete attended a **different HIGH SCHOOL** other than Hug High School.
6. Rules Acknowledgements and Documents
 - Each document must be opened, agreed and e-signed electronically
 - Additional Physical/Medical Documents must be obtained from the Hug Main Office or downloaded from RMA, completed, and uploaded into the RMA account prior to the student/athlete being considered “cleared”.
 - **NIAA Health Questionnaire/Interim Form** – Completed 2nd and 4th year of athletic participation.
 - **Pre-Participation History Form** – Completed 1st and 3rd year of athletic participation with physical.
 - **NIAA Pre-Participation Physical Evaluation Form** (Needed 1st and 3rd year of athletic participation)
7. Complete Registration

Your registration is complete once ALL items on the checklist have been completed AND you have uploaded or turned in your completed physical/medical forms to the Athletic Secretary.
