Groundhog's day is a holiday that most don't really cares about, or even remember exists. Or, maybe you do and enjoy celebrating Punxsutawney Phil coming out of his burrow. Regardless of if you like the holiday or not, the history of it will help you understand why we let a groundhog determine whether we'll have six more weeks of winter or an early spring (even if it's wrong).

The holiday originates from an ancient Christian religious holiday, <u>Candlemas</u> <u>Day</u>. At first, the day (<u>February 2nd</u>) was a day where Christians would take their candles to church to have them blessed. They felt this would bring blessings for the rest of winter. It wasn't until this belief was introduced to German settlers that a groundhog became a part of the tradition. The holiday gathers people in Punxsutawney, Pennsylvania to watch the groundhog Phil emerge from his burrow to see if he'll see his shadow or not. The first celebration of this new tradition was on <u>February 2nd, 1887</u>.

Not only does it originate from Candlemas Day but the European pagan festival of <u>Imbolc</u> as well. The holiday brings people from all over the U.S and even some in Canada to watch Phil predict the weather. Though it's wrong 40% of the time, people enjoy a community celebration and just have fun. It gives people a lighthearted moment to look forward to, and to enjoy with family and friends.

In the earliest celebrations, groundhog was served as a special dish. Celebrations in the late 1800's, including the first celebration in 1887, involved eating poor Phil after he made his prediction. It was considered a delicacy, but eventually the feast for the groundhog lost interest to many. Fortunately for Phil, the idea of eating him or his friends was soon retired.

Many who are a part of the Punxsutawney Elks Lodge club claim the groundhog has been the same one since the first celebration in 1887, meaning Phil is still the same Phil predicting the weather today. They claim the secret to his longevity is a special diet, "groundhog punch" and the "elixir of life". True believers of the holiday believe that Phil is in fact 137 years old, like the club members claim, regardless of how silly it sounds.

This year marks the 139th year celebrating the holiday. He did see his shadow so six more weeks of winter!

Mardis Gras is a historically relevant event, it's been celebrated in New Orleans for over 300 years. However, it's origins are not based in Louisiana, they're not even based in America. Mardis Gras was a celebration started in Europe, and it travelled to the United States through colonization in the 18th century. So, where in Europe did it start and how did colonization bring it to America?



Now, Mardis Gras is French for "Fat Tuesday." In France, Mardis Gras was the day of indulgence before Lent. However, the roots of Mardi Gras can be traced back to Ancient Rome, though that wasn't its name at the time of

its creation. The festival of Lupercalia was a traditional celebratory event that commemorates the coming of Spring. According to Frenchmoments.edu, "Some people compare carnival to the feast of Lupercalia, which was celebrated on 15 February in Ancient Rome. This Roman festival inaugurated the civil year, which began with the *calendes* of March and continued until 45 BC." It was later Christianized, meant to celebrate the time before Lent. So, how did the celebration come to America?

Two French brothers, Moyne d' Libreville and Jean-Baptiste La Mayne de Bienville founded Mobile, Alabama in 1702, before it came to New Orleans. According to Mobile.org, "Apparently, as early 1703, the French held a type of Mardi Gras celebration in Mobile." The same Frenchman, Jean-Baptiste La Mayne de Bienville, founded New Orleans in 1718, where the tradition carried on. New Orleans developed its own practices to celebrate Mardi Gras, such as the creation of King Cakes. According to hgic.clemson.edu, "The name King Cake is derived from the Three Wise Men in the Bible, who came bearing gifts for the newborn Jesus on the twelfth night." Mardis Gras was and still is a scared tradition to a lot of people, although it has changed a lot from its roots in Europe, to the colorful carnival it has become. Its historical relevance is important, not only in European history, but in American history.

New Orleans 2025 Terrorist Attack

On January 1, 2025, a tragic event happened in New Orleans. Shamsud-Din Bahar Jabbar when into the car and ran over the crowd of people, he was driving a rented white Ford F 1. It was reported that Shamsud-Din Bahar was 33 years old who lived in Houston Texas. This attack killed about 14 people and injured at least 35 others. After the crashing the vehicle, Jabber exited and engaged in a shootout with responding police officers. He was then shot and

killed by law enforcement. Two officers were injured during the shootout.

The investigation showed that Jabber had pledged allegiance to the Islamic State (ISIS)



which led to the FBI to categorize this case as an act of terrorism. When police were investigation the truck, they had found an ISIS flag and later videos got exposed of Jabbar expression support for the terrorist organization. "We had a car there, we had barriers there, we had officers there, and he still got around," Kirkpatrick said.

During this time, lawmakers have carefully examined the FBI's preparedness and response, noting the absence of the local field office chief during the incident. Many questions have also been raised about the FBIs initial characterization of the attack and their overall readiness for high profile events. This tragic event has prompted a conference about public safety, counter terrorism efforts and the importance of community ability to bounce back in the face of this disaster. Louisiana Gov. Jeff Landry called it "a horrific act of violence" and said he and his wife were "praying for all the victims and first responders on scene."

Who Is Cupid?

Cupid is the God of erotic love, affection, and desire. Cupid is often depicted as a young boy with wings and a bow and arrow, symbolizing love piercing the heart. The Roman cupid was the equivalent of the Greek God Eros. Cupid's name originates from Eros which also translates to "desire". Cupid has become



closely associated with Valentine's Day due to his connection to the Roman Festival of Lupercalia and the legend of Saint Valentine. "In the [Greek] literary sources we have, he's depicted as just unconquerable,"- Richard Martin, a classics professor at Stanford University.

The Roman festival of Lupercalia was a fertility festival held from February 13th to the 15th. During this violent festival, the priests would sacrifice animals and use violence towards people to promote fertility. Cupid was depicted as mischievous and used his role in Lupercalia to inspire love and desire in the people participating. According to the Christianized version of Cupid's story, Saint Valentine was a priest who would refuse to obey the ban on marriage. Valentine continued to secretly hold marriages, later when he was caught he was executed on February 14th. The Catholic churches tried to Christianize the Lupercalia festival by associating it with Saint Valentine's Day. However, as Christianity took hold of Cupid, Cupid went through many different interpretations. Cupid was also seen as a demon by religious scholars. They believed that Cupid was a "demon of fornication". They depicted him as an evil nymph who fed people with lustful thoughts.

In today's modern world, Cupid is the face and a strong symbol of Valentine's Day because he represents the act of people falling in love and instigates romantic feelings."Cupid had become linked to the holiday for his love-creating abilities. It's no surprise that when greeting-card manufacturers made products for the holiday, they included imagery of Cupid that was inspired by beloved Renaissance art".

The Origin of Valentine's Day

Later, Pope Gelasius wanted to ban the Lupercalia festival and replace it with a Christian holiday. He called it St. Valentine's Day, likely to coincide with the original festival. Although it is not confirmed who exactly Saint Valentine is since there were many Christians saints with that name, the most likely is the priest Valentine of Rome.

The Roman Emperor Claudius II allegedly banned marriages for young soldiers in hopes they would perform better in war. Valentine was a Christian priest who secretly married young couples and helped Christians escape from harsh prisons. Eventually Valentine was arrested and sentenced to death for his defiance. While he was in prison, people believe that he fell in love with the jailors daughter, and before his execution on February 14th, he sent her a letter signed "from your Valentine," which eventually became associated with romantic love.
