DRESS CODE:

We need your help with dress code!

The district dress code policy is to create a safe and professional educational environment. We understand that returning to school after being at home in a casual environment has created some habits that will need to be corrected by August. here. <u>https://www.wcsdpolicy.net/pdf_files/administrative_regulations/5102_Reg-Dress_Code-v1.pdf.pdf</u> Though we have ongoing issues with certain dress code violations, with Spring in the air, we expect this will become more prominent. <u>Please work with your student about what is appropriate to wear to school.</u>

Showing midriffs:

We know that current fashion trends include short tops but as you can see from the policy below, showing the midriff is not allowed. Students will try and pull the shirt lower or pull the pants up higher, but it doesn't work. Some say they will wear a sweater or sweatshirt over their short shirt but they fail to keep it zipped or buttoned and as the weather gets warmer they will want to remove it.

Undergarments should not be showing:

Bra straps should not be exposed.

Length of shorts/skirts/rips in the jeans:

The appropriate length is mid-thigh for shorts, skirts and dresses. Large rips should not show skin that is above mid-thigh.

Hats/beanies/hoods:

These are not allowed at school.

Pajamas:

Since being at home distance learning or even during our hybrid model, students have become much more lacks about the way they dress. We have seen more and more pajama bottoms, which, unless it is a dress-up spirit day, are not allowed. We have been allowing them during this time of transition, but we need to try and get students ready for school in the Fall.

5c: Clothing must cover the body from the chest/breasts to below the buttocks. This includes all private/intimate parts of the body, to include the <u>midriff</u>.

- *i.* Undergarments shall not be intentionally exposed, includes bra straps and boxer shorts.
- ii. Shorts, skirts, skorts, and dresses must be an appropriate length, extending to the student's <u>mid-thigh</u>.
- iii. Pants/bottoms with rips, tears, or mesh are acceptable but shall not reveal or expose a private/intimate part of the body (large rips in pants should not be higher than mid-thigh).

5d: Head coverings which are neither religious nor medical in nature are not permitted to be worn inside a school building during school hours (e.g., sweatshirt hoods, ball caps, cowboy hats).

5g: Unless an exception has been provided by the school administrator (i.e. for spirit days, etc.), wearing pajamas, lounge wear, bath robes, or blankets is prohibited.
