Parents can monitor their student's attendance using the Infinite Campus Portal.

All absences will count toward possible retention, failure, or chronic absenteeism.

- "Chronic absenteeism" is when students miss more tha 17 days (10 percent) of the school year in elementary and middle school. In high school is no more than 10 percent per class period.

Inclement Weather/ Delayed Start Procedure
