Principal's Note

Spring is approaching and learning is in full swing here at Melton. As you may know, this is a time of year that students make the most academic and social learning improvements. Make school a priority. Very soon, the weather will change with spring right around the corner. It can be challenging to keep our children focused on learning. What can you do to make school a top priority for your child? Keep these ideas

- Make attendance your number one priority. Let your child know that unless they are sick, they must attend school (and be on time.) Try to schedule appointments after school hours.
- Show you care. Talk about school activities and projects. Try to attend as many school events as you can.
- Remain positive. Try to set a positive example for your child, even when your own day has been challenging. If you show a positive attitude about your work, your child may feel better about their own.

One important reminder is that our school has a wellness policy which reinforces good nutrition during the school day. Please be mindful about sending beverages and foods for snack or lunch that are giving your child(ren) the healthy nutrition they need to be productive, engaged learners all throughout the day. Candy, soda, sugary drinks, and potato chips are foods to be avoided, and staff will also help remind students that these foods should stay at home.

Everyday boys and girls are leaving their coats, jackets, sweaters, hats, and lunch boxes on the school grounds. Those items without student's names are picked up and brought to our lost and found located in the north entrance to the cafeteria. During the school year when the pile gets high, we donate these items to donation centers and shelters. Motion to approve minutes for 11/5/19 PFA meeting approved by Mandy Grotting, 2nd by Lalita Cole and motion approved. Financial update - Marie Altshuler: Put money down for Melton Mingle and paid PE teacher. Other spending is currently on teacher support.

Principal's Report - Mr. Batavia: For EL Core Grant we got 10k and are getting 33 iPads for Kinder thru 2nd grade. 46 Laptops went to 3rd thru 5th grade. 5000 Acts of Kindness is going well. It teaches the kids to be a world changer by being kind. We had the assembly before winter break. Kids have 2 weeks to document acts of kindness. The world record is currently 17,500. We can do over that in 2 weeks! We are fortunate to have such an amazing, warm, friendly school already. It will be easy for our kids to beat the record. You can see other schools have "colder" atmospheres, maybe not as warm or friendly feeling as ours. Look around when you are in the school; you will see teachers and students saying hi, giving high fives and just being kind to one another. It truly is a different atmosphere than other schools. We are starting to prepare for SBAC. Mid-April we will start doing SBAC testing. For SBAC, we will disperse computers to go in the classrooms where the teachers will then administer testing with the children. After SBAC, we have MAPS. Parent driving in the parking lot and around the school has been a HUGE issue which scares and disappoints us. Going 30 MPH down the road or looking at phones while driving is not acceptable. We can easily control this, and it is not worth driving that fast or looking at your phone. Mr. Batavia would like to thank the PFA for lunches and all that they do.



Hello Melton Families!


