Clinic Corner

Hello from your new school nurse! My name is Janet Ruyak. I have been a nurse for over 30 years and a school nurse for 15 years. I grew up in Reno and I am a Swope MS and Reno HS alumni. I am enjoying working with your students and am happy to be a part of the Jessie Beck Family.

In the next months, Melissa and I will be screening 1st and 4th grade for vision and hearing. If your student is referred, I will be notifying parents. In the fourth grade we will be doing height and weight for a Health District state study- it is an anonymous data collection but if you want your student to opt out-please contact us as soon as possible. If your student is vaccinated for the Covid-19 virus - please provide a copy to the clinic after the second dose. If your student has been fully vaccinated and in close contact with a person who has been diagnosed with Covid-19, your student can return to school as long as your student does not have symptoms. Currently, this is NOT a requirement. 6th graders are now eligible (12 years and older) to receive their Tdap and Meningitis vaccine. This IS a requirement for enrollment in Middle School in WCSD. Thank you for keeping your sick student home and sending your student with a mask on and learning ready.

I have 2 grown daughters and a hubby of 27 years.






Becky

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




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
