# O'Brien Middle School

<u>O'Brien Middle School</u> recognizes that some learners may need the extra assistance available through the Title I program to reach the state's high academic standards. <u>O'Brien Middle School</u> intends to include parents in all aspects of the school's Title I program. The goal is a school-home partnership that will help all students to succeed.

  - Counselors meet with parents and students to explain progress.

- O'Brien Middle School collaborates with other programs and family resource centers that encourage and supportparents in more fully participate ng in the education of their child.
- Infinite campus workshop is provided for parents to learn how to navigate system. Parents may also request a meeting at their convenience.

- 5. Ensure that **information related to school and parent programs**, meetings, and other activities is sent to the parents of participating children **in a format and**, to the extent practicable, in **a language the parents can understand**.

- In order to provide opportunities for the full participation of parents with limited English proficiency, invitations to parent meetings and school activities will be sent out both English and Spanish.

- Students will receive classroom progress reports as needed and WCSD report cards quarterly as a means to inform parents of current academic achievement or concerns.
- In an effort to enhance communication with our parents/guardians and respect our non- or limited-English speaking families, translations of written material and interpreters for meetings and conferences are available.
- All Connect-Ed messages from the telephone system will be sent to homes in English or Spanish, depending on the home language preference.

Allowable activities:

1. May involve parents in the development of training for teachers, principals, and other educators to improve the effectiveness of such training.

- 2. May provide necessary literacy training from funds received under this part if the district has exhausted all other reasonably available sources of funding for such training.
- 3. May pay reasonable and necessary expenses associated with local Parent and Family Engagement activities, including transportation and childcare costs, to enable parents to participate in school-related meetings and training sessions.
- 4. May train parents to enhance the involvement of other parents.
