What a FANTASTIC start to the new school year! We are so impressed with our 6th, 7th, and 8th graders. If the first quarter in any indication, this is shaping up to be the best year ever. Swope has amped up our PBIS (positive behavior interventions and supports) program which is called PROWL. Through PROWL, we recognize our students who are working hard and showing PROWL characteristics. Please ask your child about what PROWL stands for and how they are being "Panthers on the PROWL" at Swope.

To help students feel more connected here at Swope, each student is on an academic team. Students on a team have the same core (English, Social Studies, Science) teachers. This allows for the opportunity to build community and connectedness to school as well as a consistency from class to class.

Students have completed their first round of MAP testing in reading and math. Through effective effort on both their part and the part of our staff, we are excited to see tremendous academic growth. Through Enrichment, all students are creating academic goals. They and their teachers will be monitoring their progress toward their goals throughout the school year. At any time, your child should be able to tell you what their current MAP score is in reading and math, what their goal is for the next MAP testing, and the plan that they've created to get there.
