- If you or a friend need help for anxiety or depression, you can get support or mental health referrals from your school team during school hours. Know that our SafeVoice teams are ready to respond to all tips, night and day.
- During this difficult time, while schools are closed, you may need other information from your school or school district. Please do not hesitate to contact SafeVoice for help.
 Our communication specialists are ready to help you find school food distribution information or other supports available from your school.
- SafeVoice is available for all concerned students, parents and teachers, whether their native language is English or Spanish.
- Remember: SafeVoice is an anonymous platform. You may choose to include your name in your tip so that school teams can respond directly to you. Even then, we will keep your information safe and confidential, as always.

We at SafeVoice know that this is a difficult time for all of our students. We are here 24/7/365 to help you cope with the challenges we all share. Please remember that you can access SafeVoice at any time through our app, by computer or by telephone. We can all work together to get through until school doors open and we are together again.
