# MINUTES OF THE FEBRUARY 8, 2021 MEETING OF THE WASHOE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT SEXUALITY, HEALTH AND RESPONSIBILITY EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE

#### 1. Opening Items

#### 1.01 Call to Order

The meeting of the Sexuality, Health and Responsibility Education (SHARE) Advisory Committee was called to order at 5:32 p.m. Due to the COVID-19 health emergency declared by Governor Sisolak and consistent with current guidelines and directives, the meeting was conducted virtually.

2.01 Presentation and Discussion of the Proposed Sexuality, Health, and Responsibility Education (S.H.A.R.E.) Sixth (6th) Grade Curriculum, to include Lesson Plans and Accompanying PowerPoint Presentation Materials, for Draft Lesson Healthy Relationships; Digital Drama Unplugged, and the concepts proposed to include: How Easily Drama Can Escalate Online, Identify De-escalation Strategies when

Dealing with Digital Drama, Reflect on How Digital Drama can affect not Only Oneself but Also Those Around Us, and the Inclusion of One Video: Dealing with Digital Drama (3:56) https://www.commonsense.org/education/videos/teen-voices-dealing-with-digital-drama); and Possible Action to either Recommend Adoption of the Proposed 6th Grade Draft S.H.A.R.E., Healthy Relationships; Digital Drama Unplugged with any Additional Revisions, and Deletion of the Existing Curriculum Related to the 6th Grade SHARE Curriculum Peer Relations by the WCSD Board of Trustees or Recommend Revisions to the 6th Grade Draft S.H.A.R.E. Healthy Relationships; Digital Drama Unplugged to the S.H.A.R.E. Coordinator for Future Additional Consideration by the S.H.A.R.E. Advisory Committee.

It was moved by Committee Member Kelly Roper and seconded by Committee Member Ashley Wade that the SHARE Advisory Committee recommends to return to this lesson next month where we can see the teachers notes that includes discussions about digital drama and online conflict, a guided discussion about when conflict is the normal thing that happens. And when conflict moves into a dangerous, hostile place where people feel psychologically threatened. When does conflict become more than just kids being frustrated about school play? And when has it devolved into personal attack? Adding a slide at the end of the presentation with resources, where kids can go for help? Who do you talk to if you feel like you can't get out of this conflict? You feel like you or somebody else has been threatened somehow in this conflict, and see the PowerPoint in a format that is accessible to the public. The result of the vote was Unanimous: Pass (Yea: Lydia DeFlorio, Sara Kiser, Manuel Magana, Kelly Roper, Andrea Thompson, Ashley Wade, and Rabbi Benjamin Zober.) Final Resolution: 7-0, Motion Carries.
