1. Opening Items

1.01 Call to Order

The meeting of the Zoning Advisory Committee was call to order at 5:47 p.m. in the Multipurpose Room at Jesse Hall Elementary School, 185 Shelby Dr., Sparks, Nevada 895436

1.02 Roll Call

Chair Beth Smith and members Polly Boardman, Christina Pearson, Jennifer Peterson (via telephone), Adam Carpenter, Jason Shipman, and Dana Galvin were present at roll call. Members Theresa Birchfield, Lorrain Toole, Sierra Clark, Stephanie Hanna and Melissa Boesen were absent. Committee Liaison Dr. Paul LaMarca and staff were also present.

Member Araceli Martinez arrived at 6:12 p.m.

1.03 Public Comment

There was no public comment at this time.

2. Items for Discussion, Presentation, And/or Action

2.01 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES FROM THE NOVEMBER 15, 2018 ZONING ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING

There was discussion and suggested changes to the minutes.

On motion by Polly Boardman, second by Christina Pearson, the Zoning Advisory Committee approved the minutes, with suggested changes, of the Zoning Advisory Committee meeting of November 15, 2018. (Yea: Beth Smith,

2.02 PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION OF PREVIOUS ZONING CHANGES RECOMMENDED BY THE ZONING ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO SCHOOLS IN SPANISH SPIRNGS, INCLUDING YVONNE SHAW MIDDLE SCHOOL, SKY RANCH MIDDLE SCHOOL, ALYCE TAYLOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, JESSE HALL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, SPANISH SPRINGS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, EDWARD VAN GORDER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, BUD BEASLEY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, MIGUEL SEPULVEDA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, AND THE NEW JOHN BOHACH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, SCHEDULED TO OPEN FOR THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR.

Adam Searcy, Chief Capital Projects and Facilities Management Officer began the presentation of the zoning changes. Mr. Searcy explained that the Spanish Springs area Elementary and Middle School zoning presented to this committee for discussion, about a year ago, was by mistake presented to the Board as formal for action and it was approved. Mr. Searcy explained that the committee has the ability to reexamine as see fit. Dr. Paul LaMarca commented that what was presented to the Board was accurate; however, the zoning committee had not made a formal recommendation for Bohach Elementary School.

Public Comment:

Malia Puchta stated that she feels that this title is misleading. She stated that she could not find any reference of any discussion or vote in the meeting minutes since it was first brought up in February.

2.03 DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO RECOMMEND TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES ZONING CHANGES THAT COULD AFFECT ALYCE TAYLOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, JESSE HALL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, SPANISH SPRINGS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, EDWARD VAN GORDER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, SKY RANCH MIDDLE SCHOOL YVONNE SHAW MIDDLE SCHOOL, AND/OR THE NEW JOHN BOHACH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, SCHEDULED TO OPEN FOR THE 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR.

Adam Searcy, Chief Capital Projects and Facilities Management Officer, presented three rezoning options to address overcrowding at Taylor Elementary School. Rezoning option one only impacts Hall Elementary School and Taylor ES. Option 2 also just involves those two schools, Hall Elementary School and Taylor Elementary School. Option 3

involves Van Gorder Elementary School, Spanish Springs Elementary School and Bohach Elementary School.

Public Comment:

Scott Mullins suggested the possibility to change the zoning in option 3. He asked the committee to consider sending the students from the new Lennar house development to Van Gorder Elementary School; he believes Bohach Elementary School will be at its maximum in 5 to 7 years.

Malia Putchta suggested the district looks at the possibility to re-work the lines for more equity of enrollment and pointed out the district could save money in transportation should students living in walk zones attend their zoned school.

Megan Rix expressed concern over students from Spanish Springs Elementary School on variances, do they get to come back while the rest get rezoned and suggested that the district pay close attention to new developments coming into the area for student growth.

On motion by Jason Shipman, seconded by Polly Boardman, the Zoning Advisory Committee recommended Rezone Option One to the Board of Trustees. (Yea: Beth Smith, Polly Boardman, Christina Pearson, Jennifer Peterson (via telephone), Adam Carpenter, Jason Shipman, and Dana Galvin. Final Resolution: Motion Carries 7-0

2.04 PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION ABOUT THE CASCADING EFFECTS OF THE POTENTIAL ZONING BOUNDARY CHANGES STEMMING FROM THE NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL IN ARROWCREEK, INCLUDING A DISCUSSION ABOUT THE TIMELINE OF RECOMMENDATIONS

Adam Searcy, Chief Capital Projects and Facilities Management Officer, presented the cascading effects of the potential zoning changes stemming from the new middle school in Arrowcreek. Breaking ground of the new school is next month. Mr. Searcy explained that Hunsberger Elementary School, Lenz Elementary School and Pleasant Valley Elementary School would be the only three schools to rezone into the new middle school.

I am concern about my neighborhood being rezone from Pine MS to Vaughn MS, when they currently on the walk zones to Pine MS. They will be increase budget on transportation or





So, on paper, both the 5th and 6th grade students would go to Sky Ranch next year and the 7th grader could too. Your 7th grader is entitled to a variance so he/she could stay at Shaw in grade 8. There are no guarantees for the siblings but space permitting I would expect they would be granted variances.

I'm not sure if your current 7th grader rides a bus this year. Unfortunately no transportation is provided for the variances.

Hello.

I have an unusual schedule to work with patients, so I apologize that I am not able to attend the Zoning Advisory Committee.

I would like to file my comment regarding the rezoning of Van Gorder students and graduates from Shaw to Sky Ranch.

I have three children who all did or currently go to Van Gorder, currently in 5th, 6th, and 7th grades. I completely understand that I may request a variance to have all three of my children go to/continue schooling at Shaw —and that is my current plan. I find it ridiculous to have my 7th grade son have to attend a different school every year for four years—your rezoning plan would give my son the experience of being in 6th grade at Van Gorder, 7th grade at Shaw, 8th grade at Sky Ranch, and 9th grade finally at

SSHS. Research has shown that middle school aged children developmentally benefit from a stable team teaching approach that allows children to be followed closely. Rezoning would allow him to be lost and sacrificed in the shuffle.

However, the middle school years are also all about the years of developing strong friendships and sense of self—if I keep my son at Shaw, and have my other two children go there as well, all of their friends will be going to Sky Ranch. At this sensitive juncture of the middle school years, this is not the time to uproot my children from their friendships.

As a parent, I am now presented with this dilemma created by your current rezoning plan: try to keep my children all in one school so they are followed by the same teachers who will know them throughout their middle school experiences, watch them, and be able plan their education at the sacrifice of my children losing all of their friends; or send my children to a new school with their friends, but my eldest son starting over once again in another new school with new teachers who are not familiar with his performance, capabilities, or knowledge from the previous year and requiring him to attend 4 different schools in 4 years' time.

Another issue is the location of Wingfield Springs area residents in relationship to Sky Ranch. I do not believe it is appropriate to send Van Gorder students to Sky Ranch, a school 6 miles away but MUCH more difficult to get to as compared with Shaw Middle School, considering the traffic flow and lack of direct access to Sky Ranch from Van Gorder neighborhoods. Getting to Sky Ranch would require driving up and down Pyramid Highway and backing up the Pyramid/Sparks Blvd stoplight, or conversely overloading Vista Blvd and Los Altos, and then backtracking up Sparks Blvd again. You would essentially be turning what would is a 10 minute Van Gorder-Shaw drive into a 30 minute, fighting morning rush hour traffic Van Gorder-Sky Ranch drive.

I purchased my home in Wingfield Springs SPECIFICALLY so my children would go to Van Gorder, Shaw, and Spanish Springs High School, and I haven't moved because I want my children to have a cohesive and stable schooling experience in a neighborhood and schools with other families that all value and endorse education.


Perhaps the solution is to require all students currently enrolled in middle school to continue and complete their education at that school—but the students who would be new to middle school would go to the new middle school if you feel this is absolutely necessary. However, if you permitted this, you would need to allow students to continue to ride the bus who

are still attending the original middle school. Why? Because the schools will both start and stop at the same time, and a parent cannot get their kids to these different schools at the same time.

Sky Ranch will, I'm sure, be a very nice middle school. But please zone the kids who all live closer to Sky Ranch and for whom it makes more logistical sense to go there—and who likely wouldn't seek variances to other, further away middle schools. Please don't disrupt the Van Gorder-Shaw community and relationship just because on a map it looks like Van Gorder kids are close to Sky Ranch.

Please help our Van Gorder-Shaw children stay together and have a stable schooling experience.

Thank you, Mr. LaMarca, for your service and prompt response. I do not conceive of how you can have an educated discussion of zoning without consideration of programs like the GT magnet. The GT magnet makes up a substantial percentage of the population of Pine. This seems like it should be incorporated into this exercise. I am certain that Mr. Ernst will be actively involved in the upcoming zoning discussions.

From how I see the school breakdown, this discussion will impact all three of the Area Superintendent. The largest impact may be on Dr. Parks with Incline MS. Mr. Swanberg has students from Brown, Double Diamond, and Pleasant Valley that attend the SWAS program at Hunsberger, who would have a more natural progression into the new middle school outside of Hunsberger.

I know this is a complicated process. I know the parents and students are grateful for all of your efforts.




