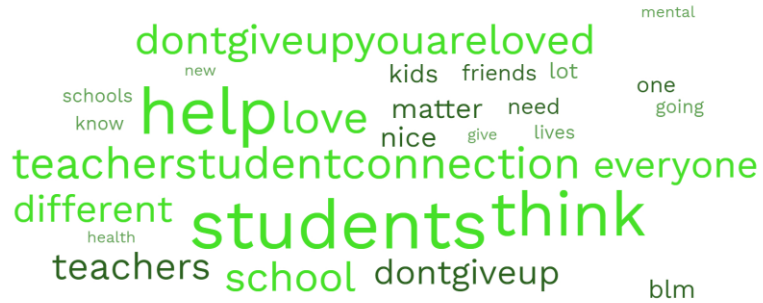


Student Insights about Equity & Inclusion
