

What is this class about?

Ukulele 1 is a step-by-step user-friendly interactive approach to the soprano, concert, and tenor ukulele that is fun, yet challenging. *Please no baritone ukuleles. There is a classroom set of ukuleles for individual use.* Students play music immediately. Ear-training, note reading and visualization are used as tools to help develop confidence and learn simple solos and group pieces. Students will learn how to read music, chords and tablature. Styles of music will vary throughout the semester with an emphasis on technique. Knowledge of music basics will be helpful, but will also be taught during the semester.

Grading

Daily Participation, Preparedness, Assignments, and Engagement	30%	Daily Participation and Assignments are the keys to getting a good grade. Essentially, demonstrate that you are working on the assigned task and you will earn these points.
Playing Tests	25%	There are playing tests every Wednesday we have class. This is to make sure you are progressing your skills and staying on track.
Skills Tests	25%	Skills Tests are monthly and summarize what content you have learned.
Final Exam	20%	The written final exam

Week 10	Syncopated strum, Adding percussion with mute strokes
Week 11	Moveable chord forms, Reggae, Soul
Week 12	Island style, <i>Third skills test</i>
Week 13	12 bar blues, Minor pentatonic scale, Transposition
Week 14	Arpeggio pattern, Alternating thumb pattern
Week 15	Ensemble work
Week 16	Final skills test, Ensemble Work
Week 17	Ensemble Performance, Final Exam
