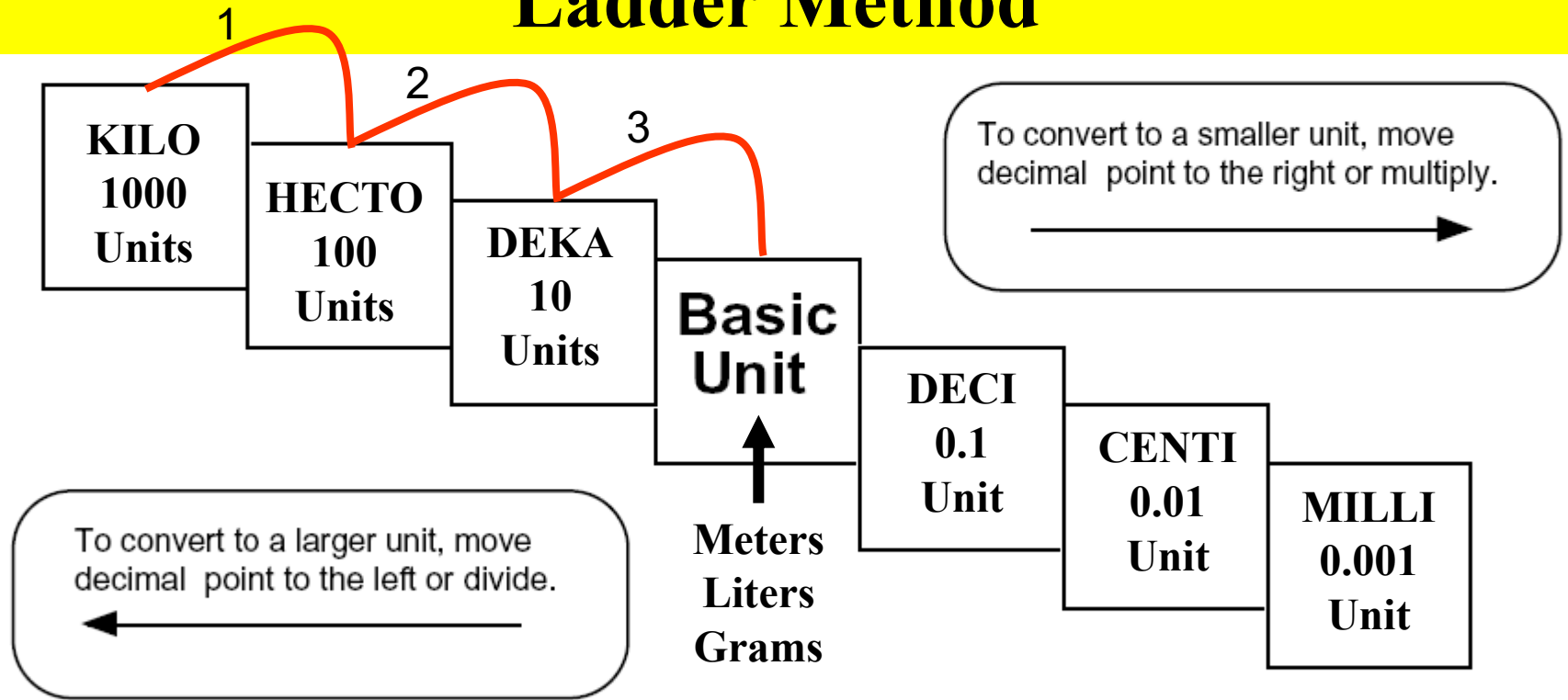

Metric Conversions Ladder Method

Ladder Method



How do you use the “ladder” method?

1st – Determine your starting point.

2nd – Count the “jumps” to your ending point.

3rd – Move the decimal the same number of jumps in the same direction.

$$4 \text{ km} = \underline{\hspace{2cm}} \text{ m}$$

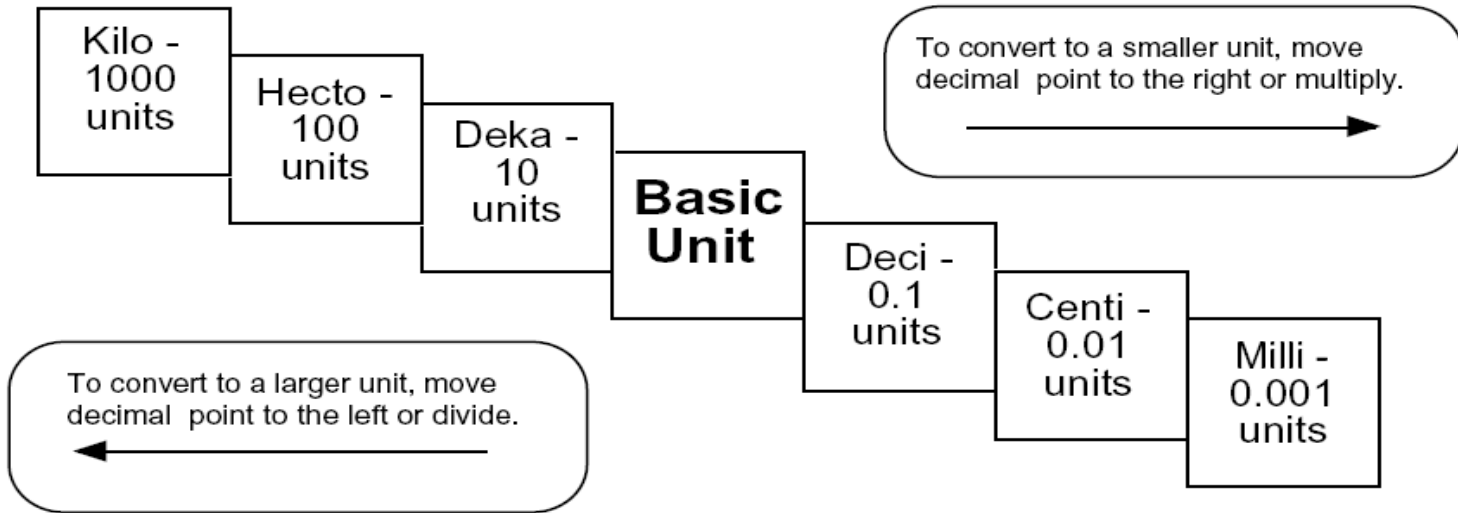
Starting Point Ending Point

How many jumps does it take?

$$4.\underline{\hspace{0.5cm}}\underline{\hspace{0.5cm}}\underline{\hspace{0.5cm}}\underline{\hspace{0.5cm}} = 4000 \text{ m}$$
