

Correcting Work in Social Studies

Except for current events quizzes and assignments from previous units that are now closed, you can ALWAYS make corrections to the graded work you have submitted. There are specific rules to this, so keep in mind:

- You can earn half the points you've lost on an assignment back. For example, if you scored a 70% on a homework assignment the very most you could possibly earn, assuming you fixed all of your errors, is an 85%.
- You are required to completely redo the assignment you are correcting, fixing the wrong answers and copying correct answers over on the new page/worksheet. If you only correct the wrong answers and try to submit it I will not grade it.
- The same holds true for essays- If you decide to redo an essay, you will be expected to rewrite the essay component completely. This means keeping what was good and improving what you lost points on.
- You must staple the original assignment to the corrected assignment. If you only hand in the corrected assignment I will not grade it.

As long as you hand in the corrected work stapled to the original assignment prior to the closing of the unit, your assignment score will be raised by the points you've earned.

Test Corrections

You will have the opportunity to correct your exam for additional points. The process is simple:

- Find each question you marked incorrectly by looking on the small grade page

- For each incorrect answer, on the same sheet you will write out the **entire question** and then below it you will write out the **entire correct answer** (not just the letter of the answer). **DO NOT SIMPLY CIRCLE THE CORRECT ANSWER!!**
- If you decide to redo the essay, you will be expected to rewrite the essay component completely. This means keeping what was good, or possibly improving it.
- The exam will be stapled with the test corrections and turned it in on time- **NO LATE WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED**
- Students who have corrected all portions of their exam will have their grades increased. Items not corrected or incorrect responses will not impact the overall score.
