Complete a Nevada Promise Scholarship application no later than 11:59 p.m. on October 31 of your HS senior year.

Apply for admission at TMCC at apply.tmcc.edu.

Complete a Nevada Promise
Program Training offered by TMCC
no later than March 1.

Complete the 2025-26 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) no later than April 1.

Learn about your placement options, such as TMCC's Alternate Pathways, or ACT or SAT, per the college's requirements.

Complete TMCC's New Student Orientation.

Complete and report at least 8 hours of eligible community service no later than May 1. Visit tmcc. edu/nevada-promise-scholarship/community-service/.

Meet with your assigned mentor at least once no later than July 1.



Complete your Financial Aid File (To-Do List) on your MyTMCC account no later than July 1.

AWARD FUNDING AND RENEWAL


Scholarship awards are contingent on available funding. In the event that sufficient funds are not available to all eligible students, scholarships will be awarded based on the following priorities:

DESCRIPTION

Established by the Nevada Legislature, the Nevada Promise Scholarship provides a last-dollar scholarship to graduating Nevada students attending any of the state's four community colleges, including Truckee Meadows Community College!

In order to be considered for an award for Fall 2025, interested students must, by established deadlines, complete the Nevada Promise Scholarship application, apply for admission to TMCC, file a FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid), meet with their assigned mentor and perform 8 hours of community service.



ENGIBILITY

In order to be eligible for the Nevada Promise Scholarship, a student must:

- ✓ Be classified as a Nevada resident for tuition purposes by the institution where they plan to receive the Nevada Promise Scholarship.
- Before the beginning of the fall 2025 semester have earned one of the following during the 2024-2025 academic year:
 - ✓ High school diploma from a public or private high school located in Nevada; or
 - High school diploma from a public high school in a county of another state that borders Nevada and accepts Nevada residents; or
 - ✓ General Equivalency Diploma (GED) or equivalent document before 20 years of age no later than June 15.

- ✓ A homeschooled student may satisfy this eligibility requirement by obtaining a HS equivalency transcript no later than June 15.
- Not have earned a prior associate or bachelor's degree.
- Meet all program deadlines.
 - ✓ See "How to Earn the Nevada Promise Scholarship A Student Checklist" on the reverse side.
- Enroll in a minimum of 12 semester credit hours in an associate degree program, a bachelor's degree program or a certificate of achievement program for each semester of the school year immediately following the school year in which the student graduates from high school.

AWARD AMOUNT

As a last-dollar scholarship, the Nevada Promise Scholarship covers the cost of the registration fee and mandatory fees not covered by other gift aid* for up to three years of coverage.
