▶ College Admissions

- ▶ Now is the time to be looking at the colleges you are interested in applying to for admission next fall.

▶ Scholarships

- ▶ Now is the time to begin researching scholarships. The schools you are interested in attending all have financial aid and scholarship webpages.

Millennium Scholarship

► Eligibility

- You must graduate with a diploma from a Nevada public or private high school in the graduating class of the year 2000 or later;
- You must complete high school with at least a **3.25** grade point average calculated using all high school credit granting courses.
 - The grade point average may be weighted or unweighted;
- You must have been a resident of Nevada, as defined by the Board of Regents' policy (Title 4, Chapter 18, Section 19), for at least two of your high school years.

► HOW IS INITIAL ELIGIBILITY DETERMINED?

- Your school district will submit your name to the State Treasurer's office if you are an eligible Millennium Scholar.
- There is no application form for you to complete.
- You must maintain eligibility!

Millennium Scholarship

- ▶ Eligibility requirements for students who do not satisfy the minimum grade point average requirements:
 - ▶ **A student who does not satisfy the minimum grade point average requirements is eligible for the Millennium Scholarship if the student:**
 - * Was a member of the graduating class of 2017 or a later graduating class; and,
 - *Receives an enhanced **ACT composite score of 21 or higher** or a combined (reading and math) **SAT score of 1070** and the examination was administered while the student:
 - *Was enrolled in a public or private high school if the student is applying for the Millennium Scholarship
 - *Meets all other eligibility requirements applicable to the student.

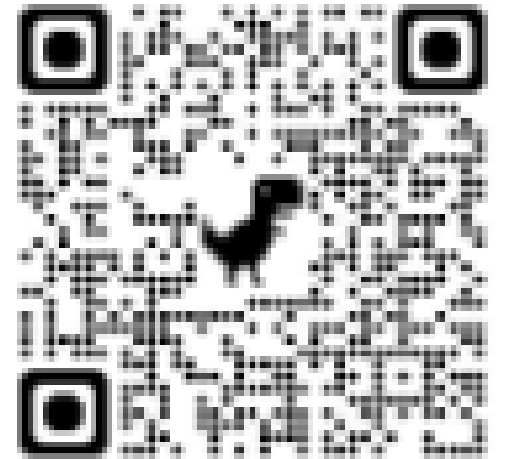

Four Easy Steps to Enroll at TMCC

- Submit an online Application for Admission: apply.tmcc.edu
- Apply for financial aid: studentaid.gov

- Enroll in classes and pay tuition: my.tmcc.edu

Nevada Promise Scholarship Application

- Students graduating in the Class of 2025 are eligible to apply
- Application must be submitted by October 31, 2024
 - Attending a Nevada Promise training workshop
 - Submitting the 2025-2026 FAFSA
 - Completing 8 hours of community service
 - Meeting with a Nevada Promise mentor
 - Enrolling in at least 12 credits

Success First Summer Bridge Program

- Students graduating in the Class of 2025 are eligible to apply
- Application opens November 1, 2024: successfirst.tmcc.edu
 - Six-week summer session offering two college classes
 - Free tuition, books, tutoring, mentoring, and lunch
 - Two \$400 scholarships for Fall 2025 and Spring 2026
 - Priority registration during first year of enrollment
 - Success First mentoring program

- ▶ The “Brag Sheet” is a form that you’ll fill out in order to help people who are writing letters of recommendation get a better idea of who you are and what you have accomplished as a student.
- ▶ The brag sheet includes your grade point average, honors and AP classes, test scores, academic honors and awards.
- ▶ You may also list volunteer and community service hours, extracurricular activities, work experience, interests, hobbies and talents.
- ▶ Include also obstacles or challenges you have overcome, or personal or academic accomplishments you have achieved.
- ▶ Be honest – don’t overvalue or undervalue your experiences. Your best is good enough!
- ▶ The counseling office has forms for you to use. If you are interested, please stop by. The counseling website also has the pdf in the Senior Information section.

Resume

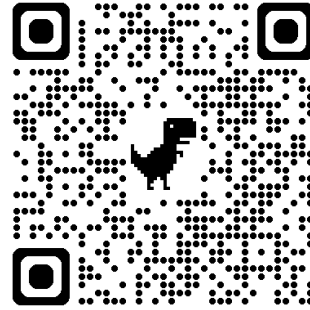
