School Updates and Information

Report Cards Distributed

Report cards were delivered to us later than planned this quarter. We wanted to let you know that your child's report card was distributed at the end of the day on Friday. Hopefully, your child shared the first quarter report with you. If not, ask to see it. Many times, we find the report card at the bottom of the backpack or shoved in a binder.

If your child was not at school on last Friday or did not receive a report card, please have your child check with the teacher assigned to our Enrichment /Extra Support class (your child's last period on Thursday and Friday).



Hand-Held Metal Detectors in Use

We are diligent in keeping our campus safe and free of items that impact our community's health and security. During any given school week, we follow-up on student reports of items that should not be at school. The most reported issue is a student with a vape. The second most reported is technology violation, when a student is concealing a phone that was used to disrupt a classroom.

Last week, we started using a hand-held scanner (like the one pictured) to help identify items that might be in student's possession. This makes our investigation of reports more efficient, less invasive than traditional searching methods, and accurate. In many cases, items are passed from student to student to conceal the item and make it more difficult to find. These wands will help us find and deter the use of items that don't belong on our campus. Spirit Days


Our next Spirit Day is November 8. We will be wearing our finest Hawaiian shirts and leis. We are challenging our students to warm up our community with their best tropical shirts.

Cub Visits

The purpose of our Cub Visits is to build positive relationships with families and partner together to support your student's educational success. Parents, teachers, school admin, and counselors come together for 30 minutes, in a unique setting at your home or another location of your choice, to get to know one another and talk about your student's academic future, personal goals, and interests. It is completely voluntary, and appointments are always scheduled beforehand. It is never a surprise or unannounced visit.

During these visits, we take the time to share your hopes and dreams for your student, academic expectations, and school resources. This is not a parent/teacher conference. It is meant to "get to know each other" and to build a viable relationship with each other for the academic benefit of your child. Studies show that these Parent Teacher Home Visits have increased student academic achievement and improved parent engagement in schools. They have brought teachers and families closer together and created opportunities for better communication between home and school.
