COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. To expose the students to many different and exciting types of music.
- 2. To engender and nourish an appreciation for that music.
- 3. To teach and practice singing in tune using healthy vocal technique in all of our vocal production: warm ups to performances
- 4. To teach music theory in order to create musically "literate" students and to use these techniques in class communication.
- 5. To develop self-discipline, confidence, commitment, responsibility, good decision making, and personal pride in a student.
- 6. To create an atmosphere of honest work and fair discipline in the classroom to insure an uninterrupted, unhindered study and enjoyment of our art.
- 7. To create an atmosphere of affirmation in our class experiences wherein it is safe to try new things and learn from experience.
- 8. To expose the students to a variety of cultures through research and travel experience.
- 9. To support our Lancer Community through service and performance.
- 10. To encourage students to work together as a team to produce an excellent product something to be proud of.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Bass Choir is designed for the tenor / bass voice wishing to earn an elective credit by participating in choir. It is an introductory class and there are no prerequisites. Concert performances are required.

Treble Choir is designed for the soprano / alto voice wishing to earn an elective credit by participating in choir. It is an introductory class and there are no prerequisites. This is required for all incoming 9th graders who sing soprano and/or alto. Concert performances are required.

Bel Canto Choir is a more difficult, faster moving curriculum that is an audition only, treble - voice ensemble. Auditions are open to students who have had at least one year of a McQueen Choir or by director's approval. Auditions are held in the spring for the following year. This class is designed to prepare students for intense performance through a rapidly moving curriculum. Students are expected to be at their very best at all times – in rehearsals as well as on stage. Concert performances are required. This class may be taken for Honors Credit.

Vox Cantare Choir is an auditioned ensemble. This class is designed for the advanced vocal student. It is designed to enable students to rehearse and perform in a very small, tightly constructed ensemble with the major emphasis on a cappella selections. Performance and competition at festivals is part of the curriculum, and the students will perform without a conductor as much as possible. This experience will prepare students for performance in a self-directed, professional vocal ensemble. Concert performances are required. This class may be taken for Honors Credit

Vocal Knights is McQueen High School's premiere contemporary a cappella group and is an auditioned vocal ensemble that rehearses before the school day. It is a fast-paced curriculum designed to train students in contemporary singing, small group rehearsal, microphone technique and choreography/movement. Students are required to perform at festivals and concerts throughout the year, and must be enrolled in the McQueen Choir program to participate.

McQ Gig Group is an auditioned ensemble that often performs at local elementary and middle schools, community events, and dinner parties around the greater Reno / Sparks area. These students are held to the highest musical and academic standards. They are required to maintain a minimum 2.75 GPA with no D's or F's to maintain travel eligibility. This experience will prepare students for performance in a self-directed, professional vocal ensemble. Students currently enrolled in the Bel Canto or Vox Cantare choirs are eligible to audition for this ensemble.

EXPECTATIONS

ACADEMIC – Grading Policies

Your semester grades will be a combination of your performance in the following areas:

40% Performance (All performance opportunities)

25% Connecting (Community Service Project)

25% Creating (Daily Rehearsal Skills)

10% Responding (Final Project)

Tests & Quizzes

In-class tests and quizzes will be given with adequate notice. We intend for you to become musically literate (i.e.: you will be able to read, interpret and perform new music.) Tests and quizzes will be written and oral, covering reading assignments, worksheets, class notes and activities, and your music.

Performances & Rehearsals – Class & Extra Curricular

Concert participation is a heavily weighted part of your grade because performing is the truest test of this class.

All absences must be excused in advance by the directors only. Any student who has as unexcused absence from a scheduled performance or rehearsal will receive a zero for that grade. Only cases of extreme emergency or personal illness will be excused after the fact.

Extra rehearsals will often be called during lunchtime, during Lancers Excel Intervention, after school or in the evening to prepare for performances. These rehearsals will be mandatory and will count toward the final grade.

The following will NOT be considered excused: Work Homework No Transportation

PERFORMANCES – Etiquette & Attendance

- 1. All students will be given a "call time" for each performance. This call time is usually 30-45 minutes prior to the beginning of the concert or "downbeat." Do not be late for your call time! Roll will be taken, and the directors will take you through warm-ups and any last-minute changes or instructions.
- 2. All performing students are to arrive at the call **fully dressed** and groomed for performance.
- 3. Attendance at your performances is required. You will receive no credit for unexcused absences.

- 4. Uniforms should be returned to the choir room within 2 school days after a performance. Credit for the performance will not be recorded until the uniform has been properly returned.
- 5. Every student in McQueen's Music Dept. is required to perform at Graduation. This concert & its dress rehearsal are considered part of your final exam!

Note: Graduation is AFTER the last day of school

Class Lab Fee:

1. Fees:

Students and parents will be required to pay a lab fee that helps to cover a student's annual choir t-shirt, transportation to district performances, a dry-cleaned fitted uniform, and choir binder for the 2023 - 2024 school year.

UNIFORMS - Care, Purchase, Rental & Replacement

- 1. Each student enrolled in Bass, Treble, Bel Canto, and Vox Cantare will need a McQueen Choir Formal Uniform (provided by the school) and a McQueen Choir t-shirt for casual performances.
- 2. Hair should be styled conservatively and out of the eyes.
- 3. Jewelry should be VERY DISCREET no dangling earrings, nose/lip rings, large necklaces, or heavy bracelets.
- 4. Uniforms should be hung neatly and returned to the choir room *within* 2 school days after a performance. Credit for the performance will not be recorded until the uniform has been properly returned.
- 5. Students will rent their uniforms and will need to pay for replacement of lost or damaged items again.

FUNDRAISING

Chocolate Sales- Ongoing

This money can be used to pay for Lab Fees, Choir Trips, Uniform Costs, etc.

Gig Group - Ongoing

Students in the Vox Cantare and Bel Canto Choirs may audition to be a member of the McQueen Gig Group where students will sing at different community events throughout the year. This will require extra rehearsal outside of class-time but can be a fun way to earn money for the choir.

<u>Driven Fundraising – Late Fall</u>

The quickest fundraiser ever! Designed to help assist students with school and travel fees for the upcoming school year. As a group, each student will send out 20 text messages to their family and friends with a specific link asking for a simple donation. This process is safe, simple, and has proven to be quite effective!
