Talking about the future: ir + a + infinitive

Say what you are going to do or what is going to happen by using the present tense of ir followed by **a** and an infinitive
 ir + a + infinitive

An infinitive is a verb that is not conjugated
 In Spanish, an infinitive ends in -ar, -er, -ir (caminar, comer, ir, dormir)
 In English an infinitive is to + word (to walk, to eat, to go, to sleep)

Let's Review: IR

Yo	<u>voy</u>	Nosotros (as)	<u>vamos</u>
Tú	<u>vas</u>	{ Vosotros (as) }	vais
Él Ella Usted	<u>va</u>	Ellos Ellas Ustedes	<u>van</u>

ir + a + infinitive

Laura va a ser médica.

Laura is going to be a doctor.

Uds. Van a caminar en la ciudad, ¿verdad?

You are going to walk in the city, right?

The expression **vamos a + infinitive** can be used to make a suggestion

Vamos a caminar en el parque.

Let's walk in the park.

1. yo / iglesia

yo voy a ir a la iglesia

2. tú / hospital

Tú vas a ir al hospital

3. usted / museo

Usted va a ir al museo

4. nosotros / Teatro

Nosotros vamos a ir al teatro

5. ustedes / café

Ustedes van a ir al café
