<u>SENIOR PARENT NIGHT</u>: Will be held on Wednesday, Sept 18<sup>th</sup> at 5:30 p.m. in the theater. There will be presentations on Scholarships, Graduation, AAA, Financial Aid, and Josten's. Parents seeking important information regarding their child's senior year and preparation for the next step should attend.

<u>SCHOLARSHIPS</u>: The College and Career Center (CCC) is the best and most easily accessible resource for learning about colleges, scholarships, and Financial Aid information. While there will be in person hours available, we highly encourage students and parents to regularly check the CCC website throughout the school year for the latest websites, applications, and general advice. The website link is <u>https://www.washoeschools.net/renohsccc</u>. Additionally, you are encouraged to sign up for the Class of 2025 notifications through Canvas. The QR code is included in your senior packet.

**<u>RHS General Scholarships</u>**: We are fortunate to have many scholarships that are designated for RHS students only. You need only fill out one application to be considered for all of them. The **RHS GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION** will be available on the College & Career website starting October 1<sup>st</sup>. The application needs to be completed by <u>January 24th</u>, 2025. It will close at 12 a.m. Students may make an appointment to visit the CCC and meet with Mrs. Palzkill if you have any questions.

<u>Millennium Scholarship</u>: There is no application process. Eligible Nevada high school graduates will be notified of their award by mail the first week of August 2025. Please refer to the Millennium Scholarship website for eligibility criteria: <u>https://www.nevadatreasurer.gov/GGMS/GGMS\_Home/</u>

**FINANCIAL AID:** The Free Application for Federal Student Aid **(FAFSA)** could qualify you for grants, loans, and work-study. Apply on-line at <u>https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa</u>. The 2025/2026 application (for Fall 2025 admission) will be available <u>in December (TBA)</u>. Students will create an FSA ID with an email address and security questions. Keep in a safe place as this is valid for 10 years. Federal financial need is based on family economic situation and applications are evaluated on a first-come/first-serve basis. **Feb 15,2025** is the priority deadline for University of Nevada students.

<u>COLLEGE FAIR</u>: The WCSD College Fair is scheduled for Sunday, October 20th at the Reno/Tahoe Convention Center. There are many colleges and universities represented as well as breakout sessions on topics such as FAFSA, scholarships, essay writing, letters of recommendation, etc. Preregistration is recommended: <u>https://www.washoeschools.net/collegefair</u>

UNR's 2024-2025 application for admission opened August 1<sup>st</sup> (<u>https://www.unr.edu/admissions</u>)

- Early Action Application Deadline: November 15, 2024
- Regular Admission Deadline (To be considered for Scholarships): February 15, 2025
- Scholarship Application Deadline (separate app. only for dept scholarships): February 15, 2025
- Honors College Priority Deadline February 1,2025 (must have done regular admission application first)
- Final Admissions Deadline (NO Scholarship Consideration) April 7, 2025
- Last day to participate in Advanced Registration: June 15, 2025

UNR Applicants must have the following to be considered for admission:

- 3.0 Weighted academic grade point average in CORE classes (English, Math, Science, Soc. Studies)

- NO application fee (in state tuition is \$288.50 per credit)

- Official High School Transcript <u>https://washoeschoolsnv.scriborder.com/</u>
- 2025 applicants may choose to send official SAT/ACT scores to UNR- used for class placement and scholarships (UNR is allowing super scoring for scholarships!)
- Other fees/applications:
  - Advanced Registration fee (\$125- guarantees an early freshman schedule and priority housing) [fee waivers available for qualified students]
  - On-Campus Housing application available November 15<sup>th</sup>; Feb 1 is the priority cut-off date (space is limited so apply early- \$300 deposit secures your spot and is fully refundable till 6/15)
  - $\circ$  FAFSA- Available December 2024 (specific date TBA)

- <u>NEVADA BOUND</u>: Nevada Bound is available for prospective students and parents to visit the UNR campus, learn about admissions, scholarships, financial aid, housing, tour all the residence halls, meet with academic representatives, and participate in informal discussions with current students. We strongly encourage students planning to apply/attend UNR to attend this valuable program. Registration for Nevada Bound days is through their website <u>https://admissions.unr.edu/portal/nevadabound</u>.

<u>UNLV</u>: UNLV does not require the ACT or SAT for admittance. Students can earn EITHER a 3.0 weighted core GPA, a 22 ACT composite score, an 1120 total SAT score or an advanced or College and Career Ready high school diploma. <u>https://www.unlv.edu/</u>

- Must invite Counselor and teacher(s) to complete application process
- Notify Counselor ASAP if applying to a Common Application School
- <u>LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION</u>: Colleges often request letters from teachers and/or counselors as part of the application process. Provide teachers/counselors with a resume and plenty of notice. Review "Letter of Recommendation Required Protocol" form on the RHS counseling website [under "Senior Information" link].

<u>UC/CSU SCHOOLS</u>: University of California (UC) application is open and the deadline to apply is **November 30**, **2024**: <u>https://www.universityofcalifornia.edu/uc-system</u>. California State University (CSU) application opens October 1, 2024 and the deadline to apply is **November 30**, **2024**: <u>https://www2.calstate.edu/apply</u>

<u>OFFICIAL TRANSCRIPTS</u>: All students must use this process when requesting an official transcript. <u>https://washoeschoolsnv.scriborder.com/</u> Fee per transcript is \$10.00 + \$4.00 processing fee for a total of \$14.00 per transcript. <u>YOUR FIRST (4) TRANSCRIPTS ARE FREE</u>.

<u>COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS (SAT (Reasoning) or ACT)</u>: Many colleges are making standardized tests optional. We recommend checking with your specific school to see if they will require them. Seniors who need them should plan to take the SAT/ACT no later than the December testing date. (Testing sites are limited and fill up fast so register early!). Test dates and registration are available online for SAT at <u>https://www.collegeboard.org/</u> or for ACT <u>https://www.act.org/</u>.Two-year colleges usually administer their own placement tests for English and Math and may not require the SAT/ACT; however, they may want something similar like the Accuplacer. **RHS school code- 290145**.

<u>NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER</u>: Students must be approved through the NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER if they plan to play sports at a Division I or II University. Check for Eligibility Standards and Requirements. Students must take the following actions:

- Apply online at <a href="https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/">https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/</a> and pay the required fee. RHS school code is 290145.
- Complete the required amateurism acknowledgement form
- Order an official transcript to be sent to the eligibility center <a href="https://washoeschoolsnv.scriborder.com/">https://washoeschoolsnv.scriborder.com/</a>

<u>MILITARY</u>: You need your high school diploma to join the military! Research military options thoroughly and contact local recruiters (see websites and phone numbers below). Consider taking the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery). RHS will be holding the ASVAB on October 3<sup>rd</sup>, you must sign up to take this test. See Mrs. Palzkill for more information.
