

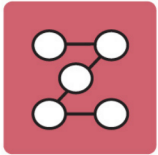

Unanswered Questions



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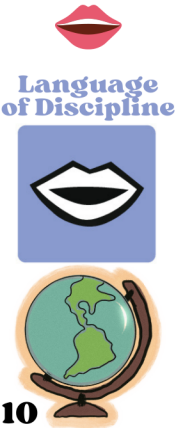
1. What are some historical mysteries or unresolved questions from this era that interest you?
