#### **Class Policies:**

- Beginning/End of Class- Check the agenda board upon entering the classroom for the day's assignments, objectives, and possible homework. You should <u>be in your seat with all required materials BEFORE the bell rings</u>. At the end of class, <u>you should be in your seat until the bell rings</u>.
- **Grading-** Assignments will be weighted based on the categories below:
  - 60%- Projects/Assessments (end-of-quarter/end-of-unit Interactive Notebook checks, tests, projects, etc.)
  - **30%- Classwork** ("surprise" notebook checks, discussions, various class activities, video reflections, etc.)
  - **10%- Homework** (see next section)

- **Homework** Homework may include finishing Interactive Notebook assignments, taking notes via EDpuzzle, studying for tests, completing portions of large projects, etc. Check the agenda board daily to see if there is a homework assignment and when it is due.
- Late and Resubmitted Work- Assignments turned in <u>up to one day</u> late will receive a <u>maximum of 80%</u>. Assignments turned in <u>more than one day late</u> (within the current quarter) will receive a <u>maximum of 75%</u>. Resubmitted assignments will receive a maximum of 75%. Please note that homework, projects, etc. are due on the due date at the beginning of class (unless otherwise noted) and <u>will be considered late if not in the inbox/turned in digitally at the beginning of the period</u>.
- Absences- If possible, you are expected to email Ms. Harris when you are absent to find out what assignments were
  missed. Typically, digital copies of the missing work can be emailed to you or provided via OneNote. You should also
  check in with Ms. Harris upon your return to school to make sure that you received all of the work that you need to
  make up.
- Notebook Checks- Your digital Interactive Notebook will be graded for content and completion at the end of each quarter. It will typically be the largest assignment in terms of point value of the quarter. It is imperative that you keep an organized, up-to-date digital notebook to ensure your success in this course. In an effort to help students maintain an organized and completed notebook, there will be "surprise" notebook checks on most Fridays. You will be warned that the "surprise" check is coming. The surprise will be that you won't know which assignment will be graded; therefore, you must have all assignments completed and properly organized in your digital notebook to ensure full points during the check.
- **Behavior and Work Ethic** Up to ten points can be earned each week (two for each day in class) for exhibiting appropriate work ethic and behavior. Being on time, prepared for class, working productively, turning in all of your assignments on the due date, treating your classmates and teacher with respect, etc. will result in full points for the week. At the end of each semester, students will be rewarded for good behavior and work ethic during a team celebration of some kind.
- **Cell Phones and Other Electronic Devices-** The use of cell phones and other personal devices in class for *educational purposes* is allowed only with <u>prior permission</u>. You are to ask if you can use your phone/device before accessing it. Students found using their phones/devices for texting, playing games, listening to music, etc. will no longer be able to have devices in class until confidence in their ability to follow the policy is restored. *See Pine's cell phone policy for more details*.

#### **Class Requirements:**

- **Folder/Binder** Please store all of the paper materials that you receive from this class in a folder or binder. DO NOT THROW ANY OF YOUR WORK AWAY. DO NOT DELETE ANY OF YOUR DIGITAL WORK. Keeping all work will ensure that you have everything that you will need to study for tests, to prepare for notebook checks, and to verify the correct grade if a wrong entry is made in Infinite Campus.
- Writing Utensil- It is essential that you bring a writing utensil (pencil preferred) to class every day. Using a marker, colored pencil, or crayon in place of a pencil/pen is unacceptable. Please come to class prepared with a writing utensil!
