- What is Plagiarism?

- Paraphrasing someone else's words/ideas without citation
- Teachers use software to detect plagiarism
- DONTT DO IT!!!!
- You will face discipline action: See North Star Student handbook

## Diploma Requirements \& Options

- Standard: 23 credits and ACT exam
- English: 4 credits
- Math: 3 credits
- Science: 2 credits
- Soc. Studies: 3 credits (World History; US History; ½ Government; $1 / 2$ Economics)
- PE/ROTC: 2 credits
- Health: 0.5 credits
- Comp Science: 0.5 credits
- Electives: 6 credits
- Arts/Humanities/CTE: 1 credit (art, music, 3rd year of foreign language)
- Flex Credit: 1.0 credit***
- A 2nd or 3rd year CTE computer course in one program of study
- 4th year of math (including Alg 2 or higher)
- 3rd year of science
- 4th year of social studies (Geography, Psychology, etc)

## Diploma Requirements: Advanced

## - REOUIREMENTS: 24 Credits and ACT Exam

- English: 4 credits
- Math: 4 credits (must include Algebra 1, Geometry \& Algebra 2 or equivalent)
- Science: 3 credits
- Soc. Studies: 3 credits (World History; US History; ½ Government; ½ Economics)
- PE/ROTC: 2 credits
- Health: 0.5 credits
- Comp Science: 0.5 credits
- Electives: 6 credits
- Arts/Humanities/CTE: 1 credit (art, music, 3rd year of foreign language)

- GPA Requirement of a 3.25 (weighted or unweighted)
- Meets the requirement for the Nevada Millennium Scholarshio


## Diploma Requirements: Honors

## REOUIREMENTS: 24 Credits and ACT Exam

- English: 4 credits
- Math: 4 credits (must include Algebra 1, Geometry \& Algebra 2 or equivalent)
- Science: 3 credits (2 Credits must be in Biology, Chemistry, or Physics)
- Soc. Studies: 3 credits (World History; US History; $1 / 2$ Government; $1 / 2$ Economics)
- PE/ROTC: 2 credits
- Health: 0.5 credits
- Comp Science: 0.5 credits
- Electives: 6 credits (2 credits of the same world language required)
- Arts/Humanities/CTE: 1 credit (art, music, 3rd year of foreign language)

- 8 credits of the above classes must be Honors (AP course and some dual enrollment college courses can count towards this requirement)
- GPA Requirement of a 3.4 (weighted or unweighted)
- Meets the requirement for the Nevada Millennium Scholarship

Thinking of playing sports in College? What you need to know about NCAA Eligibility!

Division I:
16 Core Courses
-English, Math, Science, Social Science
-Additional coursework from above areas
-SAT/ACT scores (must be sent directly to NCAA)
-NCAA does not accept CBE, A Plus or BYU: Pass your classes the first time in the classroom!
-Review approved courses at:

## Grad Plan

- Grad plans being mailed will be for standard diplomas only. If you are trying for an Advanced or Honors diploma, be sure to review previous slide with what is needed. (Ex: 4th yr math, 3rd yr science, etc)
- Each box under the subject represents a semester course or a $1 / 2$ credit
- Boxes that are filled represent classes that have been completed and credit has been earned
- Boxes that are blank are credits you still need for graduation
- Current courses for this semester will not be on grad plan until you have passed and completed them.

## All Juniors and Sophomores must carry a minimum of 6 courses.

This is a full schedule at North Star.
2 course can be outside of North Star (ie Dual Credit, Concurrent, Correspondence, etc)

## Want to take an Honors course:

Should earn at least a B in the subject at semester.

- Recommend to introduce these classes slowly.
- Adding 3+ advanced courses at once without prior advanced classes is not recommended.
- If you are attending a different school next year, you must contact the counselor at that school to fill out their course selection sheet.
- If you are unsure whether you will stay with NorthStar or not, please complete the Course Selection Form
- If you do not complete the Course Selection Form by the due date of March 17 th, I will have to choose your classes for you.
- Schedule changes in the fall will NOT be approved for any other reason other than meeting graduation requirements. Choose wisely and choose for the full year.
- ACT Exams are required for graduation. This is taken in the Spring of Junior Year
- Course Selection forms must be submitted by March 17th.
